Exodus Study #26

Exodus 24:1-18

1. Verses 1-8

- a. What does God's command about who may approach Him reveal about His holiness?
- b. How do the people respond to God's words, and why is that significant?
- c. What role do sacrifice and blood play in confirming the covenant?
- d. What does "the blood of the covenant" teach about the cost of relationship with God?

2. Verses 9-11

- a. What do the leaders of Israel see, and how is God's glory described?
- b. What is surprising about their experience in God's presence?
- c. Why is eating and drinking before God significant?

3. Verses 12-18

- a. Why does God call Moses further up the mountain, and what will He receive?
- b. What does the description of God's glory communicate to Israel?
- c. Why might the six days of waiting be significant?
- d. What does Moses remaining on the mountain for forty days teach us about waiting on God?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
