Exodus Study #28

Exodus 26:1-37

1. Verses 1-6

- a. What stands out about the curtains' materials and craftsmanship?
- b. What is the significance of the cherubim woven into the curtains, and how does this reflect God's holiness in worship?

2. Verses 7-14

- a. Why are there multiple layers covering the Tabernacle?
- b. What might the progression from fine linen to more rugged coverings symbolize about God's glory and hiddenness?

3. Verses 15-30

- a. What stands out about the Tabernacle's framework?
- b. Why is it important that everything is built "according to the pattern," and what does that teach us about God's character?

4. Verses 31-35

- a. What separates the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place?
- b. Why is it significant that God's presence is veiled from the people? How does this help us understand the seriousness of sin and access to God?

5. Verses 36-37

- a. What is the function of the entrance screen to the Tabernacle?
- b. How is the entrance different from the inner veil, and why?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
