### **Exodus Study #32**

#### **Exodus 31:1-18**

##### **1. Verses 1-11**

- a. What stands out about God choosing and filling Bezalel and Aholiab with His Spirit?
- b. Why is craftsmanship and skill described as Spirit-enabled for building the Tabernacle?
- c. What does this reveal about how God equips people for His work?
- d. How does this challenge the idea that only “spiritual” tasks matter to God?

##### **2. Verses 12-17**

- a. Why is the Sabbath repeated here in the middle of Tabernacle instructions?
- b. What does it mean that the Sabbath is a “sign” of God’s covenant with Israel?
- c. How does Sabbath rest function as both obedience and trust in God’s provision?

##### **3. Verse 18**

- a. Why does God give Moses the tablets of testimony at this moment?
- b. What is the significance of them being written “with the finger of God”?
- c. How does this moment reinforce the authority and holiness of God’s covenant?

## How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
  - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
  - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
  - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
  - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
