Exodus Study #35

Exodus 34:1-35

1. Verses 1-9

- a. Why does God have Moses make new tablets after Israel's sin with the golden calf?
- b. What does God revealing His character teach us about who He is?
- c. Why does Moses respond by worshiping after hearing who He is?

2. Verses 10-17

- a. What covenant does God make with Israel?
- b. Why does God warn Israel not to worship other gods?
- c. What does this reveal about God's desire for His people to be set apart?

3. Verses 18-28

- a. Why does Moses spend another forty days and nights with the Lord?
- b. What does Moses' time with God teach us about seeking His presence?
- c. Why do you think God repeats these commands to Israel?

4. Verses 29-35

- a. Why does Moses' face shine after meeting with God?
- b. Why are the people afraid to come near Moses?
- c. What does this reveal about the glory of God and how it affects those who encounter Him?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
