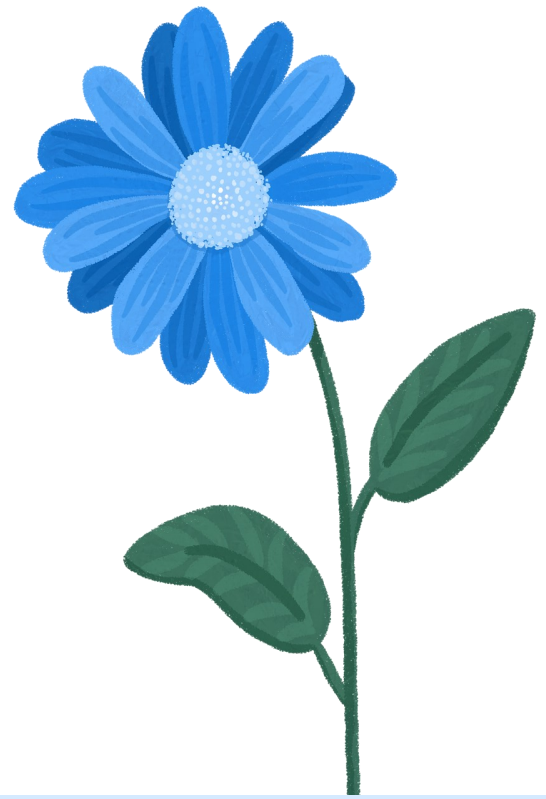
Faithful in the Small Things

“Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much...” – Luke 16:10

In a world that often celebrates the big, the bold, and the visible, it can be easy to overlook the quiet importance of small things. We tend to measure success by major milestones, public recognition, or large accomplishments. Achievements that are seen and applauded are often the ones that receive the most attention. Yet in God’s kingdom, the measure of faithfulness looks very different. Jesus reminds us in Luke 16:10 that trust is built—and proven—not in the grand moments, but in the everyday choices that often go unseen.

Faithfulness in the “little” is where true character is formed. It is developed in the hidden places of life—the moments that never make headlines and may never be recognized by others. It’s in the early morning prayers whispered before the day begins. It’s in choosing patience when frustration would be easier. It’s in offering kindness when it isn’t returned, and in showing integrity when no one else is paying attention. These are the moments that shape who we are at our core.

Scripture consistently shows us that God values faithfulness long before He entrusts greater responsibility. Consider David, who was faithfully tending sheep in the fields before he was ever anointed king. In those quiet pastures, far from the spotlight, David learned dependence on God, courage in the face of danger, and responsibility over what had been entrusted to him. The same pattern appears in the lives of the disciples. They were ordinary men—fishermen, tax collectors, individuals living routine lives—yet they were faithful in responding to Jesus’ call. Their willingness to follow Him in the small, daily steps of obedience positioned them to be used in extraordinary ways. God did not choose them because they had already achieved greatness; He chose them because their hearts were willing and faithful.

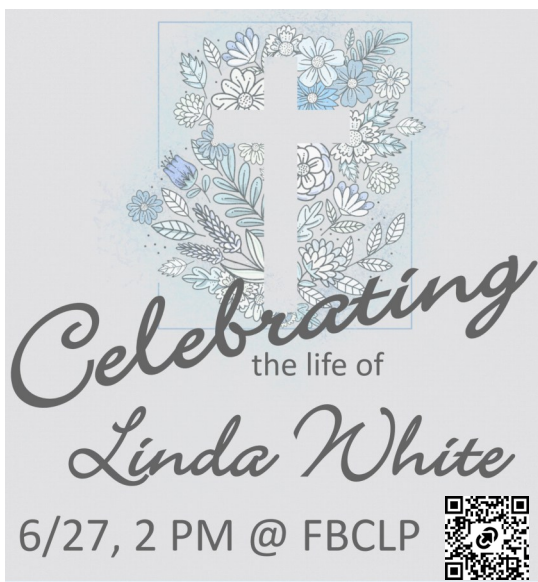
This truth can be both encouraging and challenging. It is encouraging because it reminds us that no act of obedience is ever wasted. Even the smallest step of faith matters in the eyes of God. At the same time, it challenges us to examine how we live in the details of our lives. It asks us to consider whether we are truly being good stewards of what has already been placed in our hands.

Are we faithful with our time, or do we allow distractions to consume it? Are we faithful in our relationships, choosing to love, forgive, and support others even when it’s difficult? Are we faithful in our responsibilities, giving our best effort even when the task feels routine or unnoticed? These questions are not meant to burden us, but to realign our perspective with God’s.

One of the greatest misconceptions we can fall into is believing that our impact is tied only to large opportunities. We may find ourselves waiting for something bigger—a larger platform, a more significant role, or a clearer sense of purpose—thinking that then we will fully step into faithfulness. But Jesus teaches the opposite. Faithfulness does not begin when the opportunity grows; it begins exactly where we are.

In fact, how we handle the small things often determines whether we are ready for the larger ones. If we are careless with what seems insignificant, we may miss the preparation God is doing within us. But when we approach every responsibility, no matter how small, with diligence and a heart to honor God, we grow in ways that prepare us for what lies ahead.

As a church family, this principle has powerful implications. The strength of a church is not built solely on large events or visible ministries, but on the consistent faithfulness of its people. It’s in the volunteer who shows up week after week. It’s in the person who quietly checks on a neighbor. It’s in the prayers offered behind the scenes, the encouragement given in passing, and the countless unseen acts of service that hold everything together. Cont. p. 4

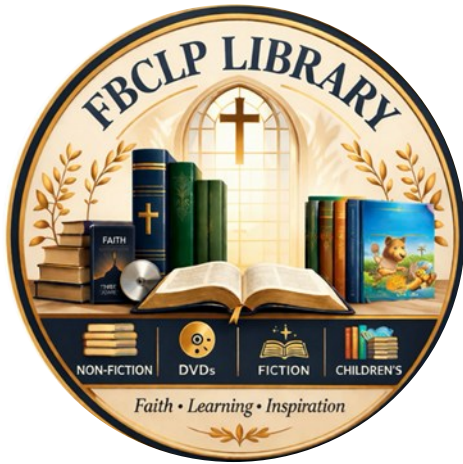

These small, faithful actions create a foundation that allows the church to flourish. When each person commits to being faithful in their own sphere, the collective impact becomes something far greater than any one individual could accomplish alone. God uses these ordinary moments to build an extraordinary community rooted in love, trust, and obedience.

It is also important to remember that faithfulness is not about perfection. We will have moments where we fall short, where we miss opportunities, or where our consistency wavers. But faithfulness is ultimately about direction, not perfection. It is about continually choosing to return to God, to realign our hearts, and to keep moving forward in obedience.

There is a quiet beauty in a life marked by steady faithfulness. It may not always be recognized by the world, but it is deeply honored by God. Over time, those small, consistent choices shape a legacy that reflects His character. They influence our families, strengthen our communities, and point others toward Him.

So, wherever you find yourself today, embrace the “little” things in front of you. See them not as insignificant tasks, but as opportunities to honor God. Be intentional with your time, your words, and your actions. Trust that God sees every detail and that He is working through each moment of obedience.

In His perfect timing, what is done in the small will bear fruit in ways that may far exceed what we can see right now. Faithfulness in the little is never wasted—it is the very pathway through which God accomplishes His greater purposes.

For all of us — children of this be our prayer and

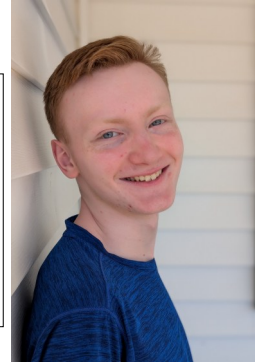
the only perfect Father — may intention:

Emmett graduated from North Point High School. He will attend Purdue University where he will be in Navy ROTC and major in political science.



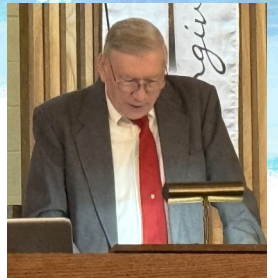
Gracelynn Nicklis
