



Parent Information for Kid's Camp

What Should My Child Bring to Camp?

Bible, sleeping bag/pillow, practical clothing for 4 days, jacket/rain jacket, towel, washcloth, modest swimsuit (one piece for girls), toiletry items such as shampoo, soap, brush/comb, toothbrush/toothpaste, two pairs of shoes and any medications regularly taken. **Please send clothes/shoes to camp that can get messy. Please label your child's belongings.**

What Not to Bring

Cell phones, tablets, electronic games, toys (teddy bear for sleeping is okay), valuables. Camp is a time to unplug! Kids will not be allowed to use these items at camp. We will collect any items of this nature at the start of camp and return at the end of camp. Our goal at camp is for kids to spend time in the great outdoors, doing fun activities, making new friends and most of all, spending time with God. Also, our camp is not responsible for any possessions that are stolen or lost. Thank you for your cooperation on this.

Roommate Requests

Camp Arrival/Departure

Registration starts at 2:00 pm on Monday. Please plan to get here between 2:00 and 4:00 pm. First meal is at 5:30 pm. Pick up is Friday at 10:30am. A \$25 late fee will be assessed after 11:00 am.

Snack Shack

Campers can bring money to spend at the snack shack. There will be 3 times (Tuesday-Thursday) they can purchase snacks. Cash will be turned in at check-in and placed in the camp bank for safekeeping. Spending cards will be issued. Each child can go to the snack shack and the spending card will be on file. Unspent money will be returned on the last day of camp.

BGMC Special Missions Project

Each year our kid's camps raise money for a special missions project. Your child can bring a special offering for this project. You can designate your child's offering at registration. We will have a competition to raise money at camp.

Phone Policy

We would emphasize that kids NOT bring a cellphone to camp. If your child brings a cellphone to camp, it will be collected and returned at the end of camp. Our camp cannot be responsible for stolen or lost items.

Although you may want to check in periodically with your child, we have found that it makes the child homesick if the parent calls. You can feel free to call me if you need to check on your child. (Pastor Pam Hodges – (907) 952-4618) Our experience over the years has been that kids do better than their parents at going to camp! Often parents imagine their child is lonely or missing them terribly. Most of the time they are happy, carefree and enjoying the experience. If they ask to call, I can make it possible but often if you don't hear from them it's because they are doing great!

Some great things to pray for are: Safety, health, that friendships would be made, that our leaders would have plenty of energy and words of wisdom for their campers, and most of all, that each child would have an encounter with God at camp.
