EASTER WEEK

It's only March, but our most significant and meaningful church events are coming up as we transition to the first week of April. **PALM SUNDAY, March 29** will be a great celebration across our campus worship services as Holy Week begins with 'Hosannas', palm branches, and children singing. As with the gospel's accounts of the journey of Jesus into Jerusalem

(Matthew 21-26, Mark 11-14, Luke 19-22, John 12-18), the celebration is short lived as we head into Last Supper and betrayal of Jesus, just four days later.

MAUNDY THURSDAY, April 2 at 6:00 p.m. will be a silent, reflective service in Chipley Hall focused on the Lord's Supper, scripture, and prayer. The story continues too quickly as Jesus is arrested, put to trial, mocked, beaten, scorched, humiliated, and finally paraded through the streets to his crucifixion. **GOOD FRIDAY, April 3 at 6:00 p.m.** in the Sanctuary will feature the Sanctuary Choir, Orchestra, and soloists in a dramatic presentation called **PASSION**, which tells the full story from Palm Sunday to the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. Saturday is purposely quiet, both in scripture and throughout the church campus.

EASTER SUNDAY is always an amazing time of musical and scriptural celebration in each service...Vietnamese, Traditional, and Contemporary. With so many guests and family attending each service, parking and seating will be a wonderful challenge. The Flowering of the Cross will be the perfect place for family pictures and a way to conclude this monumental week in the life of our church. Please put all of these events on your calendar and plan to bring friends and family with you for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday.
