Dr. Barry Howard is the retired Senior Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Pensacola; serving from 2005-2017. Since retiring from FBCP, Dr. Howard has served as a leadership coach and consultant with the Center for Healthy Churches. He is currently serving as the interim pastor at the First Baptist Church of Huntsville, Alabama.

Following his retirement in Pensacola, he served as the interim pastor at the Greystone Baptist Church in Raleigh and the Myrtle Grove Baptist Church in Pensacola. From 2020-2024, he served as the transitional pastor at the Church at Wieuca in North Atlanta.

In his earlier years, Dr. Howard served as the pastor at the First Baptist Church of Williams, the Brookwood Baptist Church in Birmingham, the First Baptist Church of Corbin (KY), and the Post Oak Springs Baptist Church in Jacksonville (AL). He earned a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Arts from Jacksonville State University, a Master of Divinity from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, a Doctor of Ministry from Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, and completed additional studies at Oxford University. He has also served as an adjunct professor at the University of Kentucky, Eastern Kentucky University, and Samford University. He completed Executive Leadership Coach training at the Pastoral Institute in Columbus, Georgia.

Dr. Howard has a passion for fostering healthy practices among clergy and congregations. In addition to his love for the local church, he enjoys golf, reading, and writing. His columns are also frequently posted or published by Good Faith Media, Baptist

Raised in Bluff Park, Alabama, Ryan Whitley has dedicated more than 40 years to ministry, including the past 30 years as Pastor of First Baptist Center Point/CrossPoint Church in Trussville, Alabama. He earned a Master of Divinity from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary and a Doctor of Ministry from Beeson Divinity School.

In addition to his pastoral ministry, Ryan has invested in the next generation of church leaders through his service as an adjunct professor and, more recently, as a mentor to aspiring pastors at Beeson Divinity School. He also currently serves as First Vice President of the Alabama Baptist Convention.

Ryan and his wife, Vonda, have been married since 1986 and have two children. Their son, Taylor, and his wife, Lydia, live in Berlin, Germany, where they serve at Community Church Berlin. Their daughter, Kelsey, who is recently engaged, lives and works in the Birmingham area.

Dr. Randel Everett accepted the position of Senior Fellow for Religious Freedom at Dallas Baptist University after retiring as Founding President of 21Wilberforce.

He spent four decades as pastor of churches in Florida, Virginia, Arkansas, and Texas before founding 21Wilberforce in 2014 to focus attention on religious persecution abroad and the enduring importance of religious liberty in the United States.

Everett was the Founding President of the John Leland Center for Theological Studies in Falls Church, Virginia and his wife Sheila was the Dean of Students at Leland. He served as the Executive Director of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

Throughout his career, Everett has traveled to nearly 50 countries, meeting with religious and government leaders and witnessing first-hand the ravages of persecution.

He holds a bachelor's degree from Ouachita Baptist University in Arkansas and Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas. Dr. Everett also has an honorary Doctor of Divinity from the University of Richmond and Doctor of Humanities from Dallas Baptist University.

Sheila and Randel returned to Pensacola in June of 2025, after he served as pastor of FBCP from 1992-1996. Their son Jeremy and his wife Amy, live in Waco and have three sons: Lucas, Sam and Wyatt. Their daughter, Rachel, and her husband Eric, live in Orlando with their daughter Klara.

He also has authored several books and founded a daily nationwide broadcast ministry which aired from 2010 to 2024. Proverbs 31:13, 20. "She seeketh wool and flax, and worketh willingly with her hands. She stretcheth out her hand to the poor; yea, she reacheth forth her hands to the needy."

"A woman named Dorcas was referred to in the Bible as a disciple. She could have given of her coins, but she chose to give of herself also. She saw the poor and needy people, widows and orphans as they wandered up and down the beach in Joppa searching for rags swept in by the waters of the sea. To these poor people, without sufficient clothing, good rags washed up on the shore must have been like gold nuggets. Dorcas became stirred with the desire to help them. With her sewing needle as her tool and her home as her workshop, she established a service that has reached to the far corners of the earth.
