Matthew 7:1-5

Developing a Jesus worldview requires intentional study, practice, self-examination, and grace.

Key Concepts:

- Every person views life through a particular lens (worldview).
- A Jesus worldview must be intentionally developed and continually adjusted.
- Self-examination precedes helping others.
- Grace transforms judgment into compassion.

1. We Learn to Live with a Jesus Worldview by Studying and Practicing the Teachings of Jesus.

Dr. Barry Howard is the retired Senior Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Pensacola; serving from 2005-2017. Since retiring from FBCP, Dr. Howard has served as a leadership coach and consultant with the Center for Healthy Churches. He is currently serving as the interim pastor at the First Baptist Church of Huntsville, Alabama.

Following his retirement in Pensacola, he served as the interim pastor at the Greystone Baptist Church in Raleigh and the Myrtle Grove Baptist Church in Pensacola. From 2020-2024, he served as the transitional pastor at the Church at Wieuca in North Atlanta.

In his earlier years, Dr. Howard served as the pastor at the First Baptist Church of Williams, the Brookwood Baptist Church in Birmingham, the First Baptist Church of Corbin (KY), and the Post Oak Springs Baptist Church in Jacksonville (AL). He earned a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Arts from Jacksonville State University, a Master of Divinity from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, a Doctor of Ministry from Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, and completed additional studies at Oxford University. He has also served as an adjunct professor at the University of Kentucky, Eastern Kentucky University, and Samford University. He completed Executive Leadership Coach training at the Pastoral Institute in Columbus, Georgia.

Dr. Howard has a passion for fostering healthy practices among clergy and congregations. In addition to his love for the local church, he enjoys golf, reading, and writing. His columns are also frequently posted or published by Good Faith Media, Baptist News Global, The Christian Century, The Alabama Baptist, The Baptist Standard (TX), The Florida Baptist Witness, Church Executive, The Center for Healthy Churches, and The Lewis Center for Church Leadership.
