Matthew 5:9



*Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they shall be called
sons of God.*

Big Idea

Jesus wants us to help make peace.
When we make peace, we show God's
love—and we live like His children.



What Is a Peacemaker?

- A peacemaker helps people come back together.
- A peacemaker does more than stop a fight—he or she helps bring healing.
- Peacemakers use kind words, listening ears, and loving actions.



Peacekeeper or Peacemaker?

- A peacekeeper may only separate people for a little while.
- A peacemaker helps solve the problem with truth, kindness, and forgiveness.
- Jesus calls us to be peacemakers.



Watch Out!

- Some people are peace breakers—they make the fight worse.
- Some people are peace fakers—they pretend nothing is wrong but stay upset inside.
- Jesus wants us to bring peace in the right way.



Jesus Shows Us How:

- Jesus came to bring peace between us and God.
- He moved toward broken people with love.
- He teaches us to forgive, help, and make things right.



Bible Examples:

- Joseph forgave his brothers. (*Genesis 50:15–21*)
- Abigail helped stop a fight. (*1 Samuel 25*)
- Jesus made peace for us through the cross. (*Romans 5:10*)

3. What can you say when someone feels hurt?
4. How can Jesus help you make peace this week?
