



Galatians: Children Of Freedom – Galatians 4:21-31

Memory Verse: Galatians 4:31 “So, brothers, we are not children of the slave but of the free woman.”

1. Abraham and Sarah believed God’s promise but tried to accomplish it through their own plan. Where are you most tempted to “help God out” rather than trust His timing or His way?
2. The message contrasted human effort with God’s promise. What is one area of your life where you are currently relying more on your own effort than on God?
3. We looked at many ways Christians can begin thinking like slaves again: performance, fear, comparison, shame, control, people pleasing, and religious scorekeeping. Which one do you recognize most in yourself right now?
4. Do you find yourself believing that God is more pleased with you when you are doing well spiritually and more distant when you fail? What does the gospel say instead?
5. Are there any spiritual disciplines, convictions, or acts of service that have quietly become a scoreboard for measuring yourself or other Christians?
6. Paul says, “Now you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise.” What would change in your daily life if you really believed your identity and acceptance rested on God’s promise rather than your performance?
7. What is one form of slavery you need to “cast out” and stop returning to? What would living as a son or daughter of freedom look like in that area this week?
