



Galatians: The Gospel From God – Galatians 1:11-24

Memory Verse: Galatians 1:15–16 “But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and who called me by his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately consult with anyone.”

1. Paul says the gospel is not a human invention but a revelation from Jesus Christ. Where are you most tempted to shape your view of God around personal opinions, preferences, or cultural ideas rather than what God has revealed in Scripture?
2. Paul was sincere and passionate before meeting Jesus, but his passion was directed against God’s purposes. Is there an area where you may be passionate, confident, and possibly wrong? How can you submit that area to Christ?
3. Paul counted his former achievements as loss for the sake of knowing Christ (Philippians 3:7). What accomplishment, identity, tradition, or reputation are you most tempted to place confidence in?
4. God did not necessarily remove Paul’s passion and abilities. He redirected them for His kingdom. What passion, skill, experience, or part of your past could God redirect for His purposes?
5. Galatians 1:15–16 emphasizes that God set Paul apart, called him by grace, and revealed His Son to him. How does knowing that salvation begins with God’s grace change the way you view your own story?
6. Paul’s encounter with Jesus gave him a new mission. How has knowing Christ changed the purpose and direction of your life? Where might God be asking you to live more intentionally for His mission?
7. The churches glorified God because Paul’s transformed life was undeniable. If someone examined your life today, what evidence would they see that the gospel has changed you? What area still needs to be surrendered?
