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➤ HVAC SYSTEMS

Replacing aging systems to support ministry for years to come.

Many of Atonement's HVAC systems have faithfully served our congregation for decades and are now well beyond their expected service life. Replacing them is the highest priority of Prepare for the Bite, helping ensure our worship, education, and gathering spaces remain comfortable and welcoming throughout the year.



Corroded Evaporator Coil

This severely corroded evaporator coil is one example of the aging equipment that has reached the end of its service life and needs to be replaced.



Keeping Things Running

When one of the sanctuary HVAC motors failed unexpectedly, a temporary replacement was installed to keep the air conditioning running while we await the arrival of the new system.

➤ HVAC PROGRESS

Preparing classrooms and worship spaces for the future.

Work continues across campus as new equipment is installed and preparations are made for larger system replacements. These investments will provide more reliable heating and cooling while improving energy efficiency and reducing the need for unexpected repairs.



Lower Level Heating Restored

A new HVAC unit has been installed to provide reliable heating for classrooms on the lower level, creating a more comfortable space for learning and fellowship.

➤ SUPPORTING WORSHIP AND HOSPITALITY

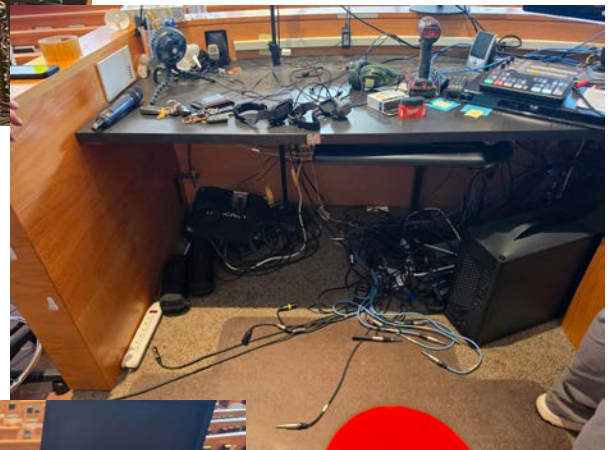
Investments that strengthen everyday ministry.

Protecting the grounds that welcome our community.

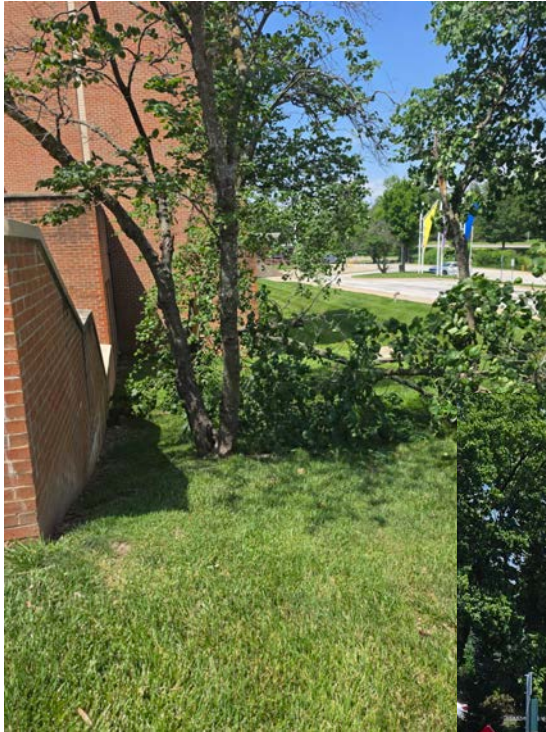
