**Who You Are and What You Have in Christ |

## **Day 1: Two Camps, One Choice**

**Reading:** 1 Corinthians 15:22; Romans 5:1; Ephesians 2:1

**Summary:** Every person alive occupies one of two positions before God. You are either in Adam, inheriting the guilt and death that sin brought into the world, or you are in Christ, inheriting every spiritual blessing that his righteousness provides. There is no middle ground, no third option. The moment faith is placed in the gospel, God transfers a soul out of Adam and into Christ. That transfer is not gradual. It is instant, complete, and permanent. Today, examine your confidence in that position. Do you know where you stand? The certainty of your standing does not rest on your performance. It rests entirely on him.

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## **Day 2: Already Blessed, Already Secured**

**Reading:** Ephesians 1:3; Ephesians 1:11; Romans 8:32

**Summary:** Ephesians 1:3 declares that God has already blessed believers with every spiritual blessing in Christ. Not some blessings. Not most blessings. All of them. These are not blessings you are working toward or hoping to earn through faithful living. They are already yours by virtue of your position in Christ. Romans 8:32 reinforces this with staggering logic: the God who did not withhold his own Son will withhold nothing else that is good for you. Your inheritance is not uncertain. It has been obtained. The God who gave the greatest gift imaginable has already committed to giving you everything that follows. Rest in that today.

## **Day 3: Washed, Justified, Accepted**

**Reading:** 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Romans 5:9; Ephesians 1:6

**Summary:** Three words in 1 Corinthians 6:11 carry the weight of an entire transformed identity: washed, sanctified, justified. What you were before salvation was real. The guilt was real. The stain was real. But the blood of Christ did not merely cover those things. It washed them away entirely. And Ephesians 1:6 adds something even more remarkable: you are not simply forgiven but tolerated. You are accepted in the beloved. God does not look at you with reluctant mercy. He looks at you through Christ, with the same complete and unconditional love he has for his own Son. That is your standing before him today.

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## **Day 4: Sealed, Owned, and Never Forgotten**

**Reading:** Ephesians 1:13-14; 2 Timothy 2:19; Colossians 1:13-14

**Summary:** When God saves a person, he places a spiritual seal upon them. That seal is not merely symbolic. It is the declaration of divine ownership: this one is mine. The Holy Spirit himself is given as the down payment, the earnest, of an inheritance that God fully intends to deliver. Colossians 1:13-14 describes the transfer that takes place at salvation as being moved out of the domain of darkness and into the kingdom of Christ, redeemed through his blood. You are a purchased possession. The God who bought you at the highest possible price has no intention of losing what belongs to him. Your future is certain.

## **Day 5: Peace With God in the Midst of Failure**

**Reading:** Romans 5:1; Romans 5:10; Galatians 2:20

**Devotional:** Romans 5:1 does not say that peace with God is available to those who perform well enough. It says that being justified by faith, we have peace with God. That peace is not interrupted every time a believer stumbles. It was established at justification and rests entirely on what Christ accomplished, not on what the believer maintains. We were reconciled to God while we were still his enemies. How much more, then, is that reconciliation secure now that we are in Christ? Galatians 2:20 reminds us that the life we now live is lived by the faith of the Son of God, who loved us and gave himself for us. His faithfulness sustains what our faithfulness cannot.
