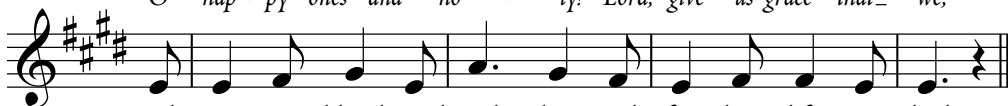

OFFERTORY

Celebrant: Let us with gladness present the tithes and offerings of our life and labor to the Lord.

Minister: Let us pray:

(PLEASE STAND)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

(PLEASE KNEEL OR BE SEATED)

Celebrant: You are indeed Holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness. Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like rain upon the earth so that they may be for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."



AT THIS TIME THE CONGREGATION MAY KNEEL OR SIT.

Celebrant: Together, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Celebrant: Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection, we offer you, O Lord, the Bread of life and the Cup of salvation, giving thanks that in Christ you have accepted us as righteous in your sight and welcomed us into your presence to worship you.

And we humbly pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be made one by the Holy Spirit, just as you, Father, are one with Christ - he in you, and you in him.

Remember, O Lord, your Church spread throughout the world - your people from every tongue, tribe, and nation - and bring her to the fullness of charity.

Remember all your people, even as we give thanks for our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection.

Have mercy on us all, we pray, that with all the saints who have loved you throughout the ages, we may endure to be coheirs of eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ.

All this we ask by him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

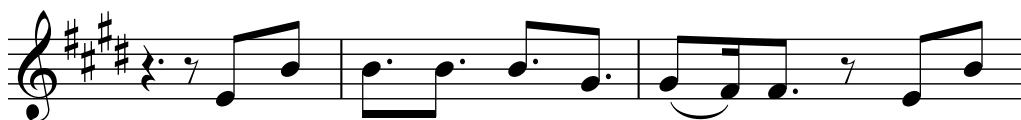
