### MOVE – Week 2

- Why do we trust what we can do more than what God can do through us?

- Acts 2
- Acts 2:1-4 (NLT) On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages, as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability.
- The **Spirit** Fills **Ordinary** People

**Skill looks good. The Spirit brings power.**

- Acts 2:5-7 (NLT) At that time there were devout Jews from every nation living in Jerusalem. When they heard the loud noise, everyone came running, and they were bewildered to hear their own languages being spoken by the believers. They were completely amazed.
- Parthians, Medes, Elamites, people from Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, and the areas of Libya around Cyrene, people from Rome, Cretans, and Arabs.
- The Spirit never stays private.

**Skill looks good. The Spirit brings power.**

- Acts 2:14-35 (NLT)
- Acts 2:36 (NLT) “So let everyone in Israel know for certain that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, to be both Lord and Messiah!”
- The Spirit points people to Jesus.

**Skill looks good. The Spirit brings power.**

- Acts 2:37-38 (NLT) Peter’s words **pierced their hearts**, and they said to him and to the other apostles, “Brothers, what should we do?” Peter replied, “Each of you must **repent** of your sins and turn to God, and be **baptized** in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the **Holy Spirit**.”
- Acts 2:41 (NLT) Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day—about 3,000 in all.
- The **Spirit** produces real **transformation**.

**Skill looks good. The Spirit brings power.**

- Acts 2:42 (NLT) **All** the believers devoted themselves to the apostles’ **teaching**, and to **fellowship**, and to **sharing** in **meals** including the Lord’s Supper, and to **prayer**.
- Acts 2:44 – 47 (NLT) all the believers met **together** in one place and **shared** everything they had. They sold their property and possessions and **shared** the money with those in need. They **worshiped together** at the Temple each day, **met in homes** for the Lord’s Supper, and **shared** their meals with great joy and generosity all the while **praising God** and **enjoying** the goodwill of all the **people**.
- The **Spirit** creates a community, not a **crowd**.

- Acts 2:47 (NLT) And each day the **Disciples** added to their fellowship those who were being saved.
- Acts 2:47 (NLT) And each day the **Lord** added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

**Skill looks good. The Spirit brings power.**

- Identify Where You're Relying on Skill
- Where am I saying: "I've got this," instead of "Holy Spirit, I need You?"
- Change the Prayer
- Practice Risk-Filled Obedience
