SPOTLIGHT CHURCH:

Delmarva church of Christ, Salisbury, Maryland

In a city of 50,000-plus (Salisbury, Maryland), this start-up congregation has had its ups and downs since beginning with a handful of people. Pictured below is about half the congregation as it stands today. They have been meeting in a hotel, and Brother Silbano Garcia and his wife Olga have been working hard with very little support. They have also been working this past year with the Boys and Girls Club and are having great success.

Silbano writes,

"HomeMission has blessed our growing congregation with Bibles, Bible study workbooks, and important tools for evangelism. This year, we used the HomeMission *Foundations for Disciples* book in our Sunday morning adult Bible class. In preparation for personal evangelism, we are about to start using the HomeMission book *The Rest of the Story of Jesus*. HomeMission has been a great help to the Delmarva church of Christ. Our congregation does not have the funds to hire a full-time minister who does the work of an evangelist.

Brother John Orr from HomeMission has been a great source of encouragement for me as a minister of the gospel of Christ. Brother Danny Aragon at HomeMission has been a long-time friend and brother in Christ, and in the past, we worked together on a few projects within the churches of Christ. HomeMission has been generous in providing us with their study materials and tools free of charge. We thank God for HomeMission and all they do to help the churches of Christ who are young and growing in the word of God and in the fullness and stature of Christ. I pray HomeMission will be around for the second coming of Christ.

Dear loved ones in the Lord,

In the past few months, we've presented **HomeMission** and the School of Evangelism to more than 30 churches, and requests keep coming. Ten years ago, we established **HomeMission** so congregations and individuals could sponsor the Lord's work—allowing us to offer workshops, materials, and our services at no cost. When you support **HomeMission**, you're eventually helping hundreds of congregations in the US, not just one.

We're seeing results, but we must build a lasting culture of evangelism in every church, regardless of size. If the Lord's church is to stop closing or declining and begin growing again, we can't depend on a preacher or one or two others to carry the load. Everyone in every church needs to heed the call of Jesus "to go." We can help. Someone

asked me the other day, "What is the program you offer?" I responded: Acts 2:42-47 and Matthew 28:19-20. Many congregations are one-generational, but that can change if God wills. We also offer the West Freeway School of Evangelism to train members in your congregation, all at no charge. Please help us get the word out: if your congregation would invite us to present **HomeMission** during a Sunday morning Bible class, Sunday evening, or whenever it is convenient, we'd be grateful. Many have heard of **HomeMission** but have no idea what we do or how we can help you create a healthy, growing church. Thank you for believing in us. We believe that together we can do all things through Christ who gives us strength. We've seen it happen repeatedly. Some have gone from 6 to 50 members, and others from 40 to as high as 190. Some are having to build new auditoriums or expand their building space. Some of you have been behind this effort for a long time. We cannot thank you enough. The Lord will surely bless you in many ways. Your prayers and support are making a real difference in our own backyard.

Operations Director Report

IS THIS YOU?

"This is the true story of a congregation of God's people. They have a nice building in a good community. The congregation is about 45 years old at the present location. They have always used

part-time preachers, been generous in doing good works, and have had regular services and gospel meetings. Their preachers knew well how to visit the sick members, marry the young, and bury the dead. But they did not know how to build a strong, growing church. They were like a hospital. They served those who came. They may be described as largely inward-focused. Their building seats about 300. Today, 45 seats would be more than enough. No classrooms are needed, as there are no children. The members are old, and so is the preacher. They have given up hope. No matter what is suggested, they give their negative reasons as to why it would not work. There seems to be no possible way for this church to be helped. It appears that death is inevitable unless an infusion of Christians from the general area starts attending. Even though there is only one class, they always insisted that the bell be rung at the end of the one adult class in the auditorium on Sunday morning and Wednesday night. A preacher friend of mine, visiting this church, tells of their only elder giving the signal to one of the members to go to the rear of the auditorium and ring the bell.

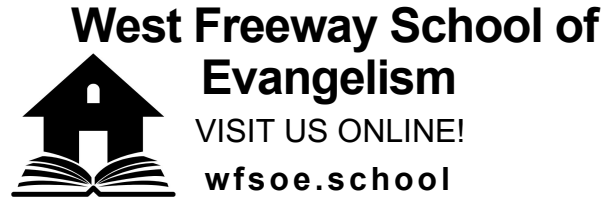
There are many other congregations that are in the same state of decline and, after a few more deaths, will expire. This has led the writer to assemble information on a number of causes of the death of churches and give this book the title, *The Last Groan of a Dying Church*. It did not have to be that way. Let me hasten to say that there are many healthy, growing churches. Growth is usually a sign of a spiritually healthy church." -Bro. Clayton Pepper

These words could have been written this week about any number of churches that gathered together this past Sunday. Does this describe your church? Will these words be written about your congregation 5 years from now? In reality, these words — and the booklet *The Last Groan of a Dying Church* — were written over 20 years ago in 2003. The challenge we face now is not new. As Brother Clayton Pepper stated in his book, it doesn't have to be that way. Are you ready to do something so that it is not said about the church you attend? More of the same, or time to change?

HomeMission Statistics Through August 2026

1. Churches reported 455 baptisms through July 2026. 1228 were reported in 2025.
2. We worked with 147 churches in 39 states in some way. We have worked with churches in all 50 states in some way in the past 10 years.
3. Since January, we have supplied \$91,121.94 worth of materials, tools, and Bibles at no cost to congregations. This is only possible because of churches of Christ and individuals around the country who support this effort. In this way, we have helped dozens of churches this year throughout the United States that need specialized material or to reorder material they have run out of. Some have had workshops, some aren't ready for one, and some already have active programs in place and just want our materials to fill needs. 4. Ten larger congregations have committed to working with ten smaller ones through **HomeMission**. Most of these help with Vacation Bible School, door knocking, or supplies. Two are helping with building construction. Several more have interest in assisting next year.
5. Seven congregations are either expanding their buildings or building new ones due to growth. These are all churches HM has assisted in some way.
6. Elders' Net (a quarterly publication for elders by elders) is being sent to 738 elders in 31 states representing 224 congregations around the country. Ask your elders if they are receiving this quarterly newsletter.
7. The fourth year of the West Freeway School of Evangelism has finished its classwork. All 13 students who have gone through the school have led at least 106 souls to Christ and are still going. Currently, we have 22 students signed up for the Fall session, which begins the last week in August and runs through May 2027. 30 students are signed up for the Monday night classes (7-9 p.m. CST), which will begin the last Monday of August. 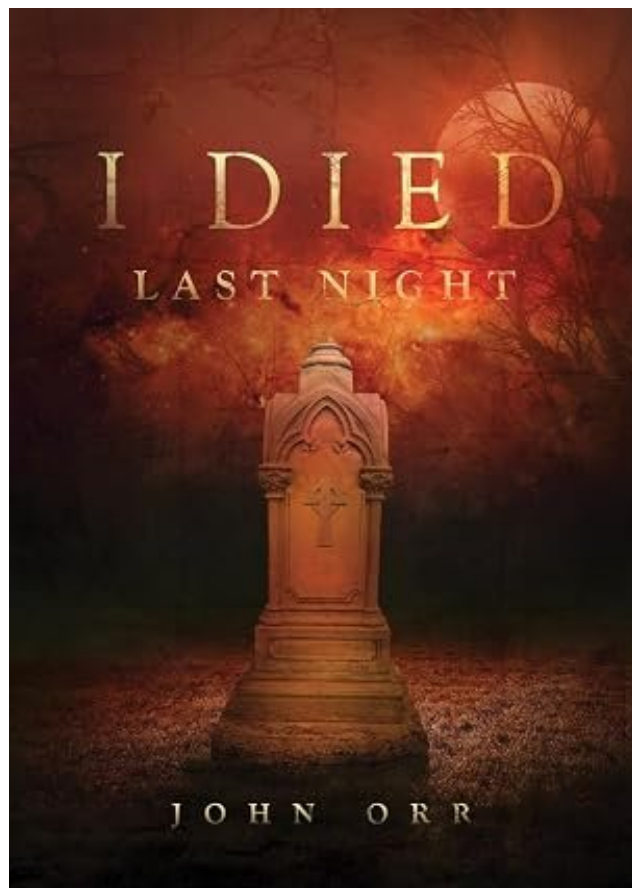

Tanglewood Church of Christ/ Odessa, TX/ Jim and Lisa Lucas went to Tanglewood July 24-26 to deliver some clothing they had received from donations in the Flower Mound (TX) area. On July 25, the Tanglewood congregation held a successful clothing giveaway. At the same time, several of the men, including Jim, were busy beginning repairs on a section of the roof that had been damaged by recent storms. If anyone in the Odessa/Midland area is available to assist with repairs, any help would be greatly appreciated.

Avenue T Church of Christ/ Temple, TX/Ave T is in the process of fine-tuning their Visitation Ministry to fit the specific needs of the congregation to better engage the community and be effective in this ministry. On Saturday, August 1, the congregation will have a Congregational Prayer Breakfast as part of their continued effort to grow spiritually.

I followed up with Northside church of Christ, Athens. They had one restoration.

I recovered from back surgery and assisted with the Connect conference.

I followed up with Teague church of Christ and Fairfield church of Christ (TX). Fairfield wants help with a VBS next year. They are still considering a LAUNCH workshop.

I assisted with the Connect workshop.

JIM LUCAS

7/6 – Traveled to Van, TX for strategy meeting with Randy & Deb Reagan / **7/8-12** – Attended and had booth at Faithbuilders Conference in Tacoma, WA where **HomeMission** has near zero recognition; had some extended conversations and made several solid contacts interested in help and more information. Attended Springbrook COC (Renton, WA). Returned home on 7/13 and left for PTP Branson, MO the next day. **7/14**– Traveled to Decatur to meet with prospective evangelist Tom Box. **7/15- 7/20**: PTP Branson, MO - Danny & Tina Aragon and I manned the booth; this was the first opportunity we have had to give away John Orr's "I Died Last Night." There were several powerful responses to this book. Also, after PTP was over, we had a request for 100 books from an elder in Oklahoma to give to his congregation. **7/22** - Met with elders and preacher (separately) New York Ave COC (Arlington, TX) as post-LAUNCH follow-up. **7/23-26**: Tanglewood COC (Odessa, TX) – Note this congregation is around 15-18 average in Sunday attendance. Rodney Carter is the assigned evangelist working with them. As a follow-up to our prior visit, my wife Lisa had collected specific clothing items needed by Tanglewood. One of the goals from the LAUNCH workshop was to implement a clothing giveaway ministry focused on local neighborhoods and the community. She collected, sorted, and folded 9 bins/boxes to take to Tanglewood. Upon arriving at Tanglewood Friday, we were informed of roof damage earlier in the week caused by strong straight-line winds. So, instead of the planned community outreach visits, I worked on the roof repair alongside 4 others, including both elders in their 70s. The 80+ year old minister walked door-to-door handing out clothing giveaway fliers. Lisa worked with the ladies organizing and prepping the clothing ministry rooms. (Update: Lisa received word that the church had five first-time visitors the Sunday after the clothing giveaway! Follow-up is planned. More work is being done to finish the roof repairs; please pray for this church. I plan to return at my next opportunity. **7/28-31** – Connect Conference in Nashville: Supported booth and related activity. Thanks to Malvin Guy (Barkers Mill COC) who arranged a couple of introductions to struggling churches. Initial presentations were made. Another new contact is working to secure an invitation to present **HomeMission** in East Tennessee following PTP Sevierville. God is good. ALSO: We handed out *I Died Last Night* books to interested attendees as we had at PTP Branson. After reading it, Tim Estes (Timeless Talks) requested I do a short video introduction of the book for his podcast, and he would mail the books at no charge to anyone who requested them. At time of this writing he has had a handful of requests. All glory to God! Additional evangelist activity: Firm scheduled LAUNCH workshops with Walterboro COC (SC) and Central COC (Savannah, GA) for October. Church followup support activity in JULY: 14 churches, 12 states.

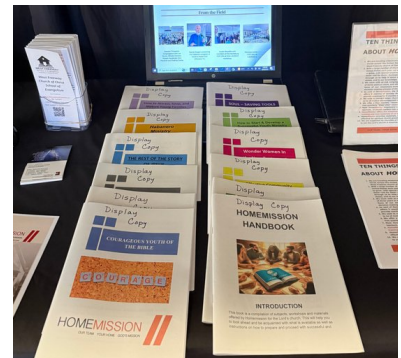
