Thank you for your interest in Calvary Chapel Christian Academy (CCCA). We are a Christian School that seeks to minister to the needs of the body. All of our classes are taught by teachers who love Jesus, love teaching and love their students. At Calvary Chapel Christian Academy, we empower children to reach their full potential through a partnership with parents and school to cultivate faith in Christ.

Below you will find some basic information about our school. CCCA is an evangelistic school, meaning neither parent is required to have a walk with Jesus. However, we do want to make clear that we will strictly be teaching from a Biblical worldview. We encourage you to make it a matter of prayer and to apply early. CCCA admits students of any race, color, and national or ethnic origin. All prospective families are encouraged to schedule a school tour and meet the staff before applying. Please contact the school office to schedule a tour or visit one of our open houses scheduled throughout the year.

Application Process: Please fill out and return the initial application to the CCCA office. There is a **non-refundable** application fee of \$50 per student due with the application. The application will be reviewed by the principal and Administrative Board. If approved for enrollment the family will be notified. All registration paperwork and a registration fee of \$200 is due within 7 days of acceptance. The registration fee is used to purchase all of the learning materials your student will be using throughout the school year.

Once classes are filled, applicants will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified as openings occur.

School Hours: K - 5th Grade Monday - Thursday 8 AM - 3 PM,

School Year: We operate a 144-day school year as outlined by the Arizona Department of Education.

Tuition: Tuition for the 2026/2027 school year will be \$6700 per year for K - 5th grade.

Scholarships: Scholarships are available through ACSTO, School Choice Arizona, or the Arizona ESA program. Contact the school administrator for more information on how to apply and which scholarship will best fit your needs.

Curriculum: Abeka for all subjects, Answers in Genesis for Bible

Class Sizes and Structure: Class sizes are kept at no more than 12 students to be able to offer more one on one instruction.

Dress Code: All students are required to wear the approved dress code. A more detailed description of the dress code can be found in the Parent/Student Handbook

- All clothing must be modest and conservative
- No underclothing may be exposed on male or female students
- No Hats, beanies, bandanas, or hoods may be worn indoors.
- No flip-flops or backless shoes.
- Hair must be of natural coloring without extreme styling.

Lunch: Lunch is not provided, all students will need to bring lunch to school. We do have a microwave available to warm food. Kindergarten students will need to bring a snack each day.

Discipline: Elementary school discipline policies should be designed to create a positive and supportive learning environment. We have implemented the Love and Logic method which emphasizes empathy, logical consequences, and shared control between teachers and students. More information can be found in the school handbook.

Security: We have partnered with Navajo County to implement the Mutualink EMS. This system allows the school administrator to directly connect with first responders in the event of an emergency. We also have security monitoring equipment in each of our classrooms.

Special Education: Based on the teaching received in 1 Corinthians 12:12-31 CCCA practices inclusivity in our classrooms because we are all one body in Christ. Although we follow the best practices and procedures with regard to evaluation and IEP development, we do not provide a “free and appropriate public education (FAPE)” as guaranteed by law in a public school. Therefore, the procedural safeguards that are provided to students with disabilities and their parents through IDEA do not apply. We do, however, commit to providing a safe, strength-based, research-based positive intervention strategy plan, and faith-based educational experience for your child.

Spiritual Life: Students begin school with prayer and a Bible lesson every day. The students memorize a Bible verse weekly and have chapel and worship time each week. During the school day, students are encouraged to seek the Lord’s will in every situation. Our goal is:

- To deepen the child’s understanding of the Christian faith and relationship with Jesus reflecting His love to the world;
- To discover and encourage the gifts each child possesses;
- To inspire each child to value and treat others with integrity and respect
