Staff Member Guidelines

1. Obey the general rules on the camper's guidelines as well as the rules on the staff applications. Dresses and shorts must come down to the middle of the knee when sitting.
2. All counselors must be in their quarters for devotions.
3. Please, no complaining! If you have an issue, please address it with your department head, who will bring it to the director, if need be.
4. Staff members are expected to complete their tasks with diligence and excellence.
5. **WE ARE SLAVES TO THE CAMPERS!** All staff should be dedicated to guiding campers to a more fruitful Christian life or to salvation.
6. All staff must be clean for services.
7. Staff are not to leave camp without the director's approval.
8. If you have a special need in the completion of your work, let the Program Director know.
9. Staff may not check out of camp Saturday until his/her close-up responsibilities have been met.
10. No hazing.
11. No weapons are permitted in any of the camp buildings.
12. No pranks allowed. Pranks usually kill the morale among camp.
13. If you know that rules are being broken among either campers or staff, it is your responsibility to inform your department head. *(Please, for the sake of our camp's program, don't let these problems get back home without our having a chance to remedy them.)*
14. Noise after hours MUST be kept at a minimum.
15. **If you have children at camp this week, allow them to take care of themselves.** This is to avoid causing the other campers to believe that your child is privileged or cannot take care of themselves.
16. Go to the altar to pray and help with campers. Fill out decision cards.
17. Stay away from the Dining Hall/ Kitchen/Canteen Area during opposite genders Afternoon Adrenaline and Swim Times.
18. Staying out of the kitchen during Meal times is a big help.
19. Do not hang wet clothes out windows or on pine handrails.
20. Please avoid using cell phones while with campers.
21. During services, please try to sit with the campers.
22. All bedroom doors are to remain open. Please use the restrooms to maintain privacy while changing, if necessary.
23. Do not use camp vehicles without permission.
24. Remember that being on staff is a distinct privilege. Somehow God will use you and your talents, but only if you cooperate. You may not agree with all the camp rules, but you are to support them while at camp. Your attitude is contagious.
