## “All Done”

### ✦ Hebrews 10:11-18

<sup>11</sup>Day after day every priest stands and performs his religious duties; again and again he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. <sup>12</sup>But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God. <sup>13</sup>Since that time he waits for his enemies to be made his footstool, <sup>14</sup>because by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy.

<sup>15</sup>The Holy Spirit also testifies to us about this. First he says:

<sup>16</sup>“This is the covenant I will make with them after that time, says the Lord. I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds.”

<sup>17</sup>Then he adds: “Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more.”

<sup>18</sup>And where these have been forgiven, there is no longer any sacrifice for sin.

**4. Verses 15-17 quote Jeremiah 31 to show that the Holy Spirit testifies regarding two promises. What are they?**

- Why is it significant that the Holy Spirit is the one testifying?
- How do these two promises relate to each other?

#### Verse 18

**5. Why is verse 18 a logical conclusion of our passage?**

- What would it imply if additional sacrifices were still necessary?
