Day 1 Our Shepherd - READ: Psalm 23:1.

Long ago, David wrote Psalm 23. Before David became a king, he was a shepherd who took care of sheep. Sheep need a shepherd because they can't take care of themselves very well. They get lost easily and can't protect themselves. So David used something he understood to describe God.

Day 2 The Shepherd Provides - READ: Psalm 23:2.

A good shepherd makes sure his sheep have grass to eat and water to drink. Sheep will not lie down and rest unless they feel safe and have everything they need. So the shepherd leads them to green pastures and quiet water. God cares for us in the same way. He knows what we need.

Day 3 The Shepherd Restores - READ: Psalm 23:3.

Sometimes sheep fall over on their backs and cannot stand up again. This is called a cast sheep. When a sheep is cast, it cannot fix the problem by itself. It needs the shepherd to come help it stand again. **Scan the QR code above to watch a video of a shepherd helping a sheep that has fallen over.** After the sheep is lifted up, it even stumbles a little before it can walk again. That is what it means when Psalm 23 says, **“He restores my soul.”** Sometimes we fall too. We make mistakes. We feel tired or discouraged. But the Good Shepherd helps us stand again.

Write one way God helps you when you feel stuck, discouraged, or struggling.

Day 4 Following the Shepherd - READ: John 10:27.

Sheep learn to recognize their shepherd's voice. When the shepherd calls, they follow him. Jesus said people who belong to Him are like sheep who follow their shepherd. We follow Jesus when we listen to His voice and obey what He teaches.
