**The Art of One-Anothering:
Loving the People Right In Front of You**
August 30–September 27

The New Testament uses the phrase “one another” more than fifty times—love one another, welcome one another, forgive one another, bear with one another, be patient with one another, encourage one another. The writers of the New Testament seem convinced that following Jesus isn’t mostly a private spiritual project. It’s something we practice together, in the ordinary friction and grace of shared life. And that’s harder than it sounds. In this series, we’ll explore what it actually looks like to live the way of Jesus with the people right in front of us. Come as you are. Bring the relationships you’re working on. This is the Christian life—practiced together.

Words for Meditation: “Belonging is not a place, but a set of practices.” – Amy Stapleton

- Where in your life have you offered tolerance rather than welcome? What would it look like to close that gap?
- Rublev’s icon leaves an empty chair at the table on purpose, waiting for someone to pull it up. Where is God inviting you to take your seat or to make room for someone else to take theirs?
