Dear praying friends,

Greetings to you all. We have been in the States for a full three months now, and it has been a wonderful blessing to spend most of that time around our hometown and fellowshiping with our home church. After being out of the country for the better part of six years, we decided to spend the first part of our furlough close to home. We have enjoyed some much needed time with family and friends. We have also been able to report to several supporting churches close to the Cincinnati area. We will now be taking the next few weeks to travel further out and report to more churches, as well as visit with some dear friends in the ministry that we have not seen for several years.

During the last three months, I have been able to communicate regularly with our church people in Kumasi. Alex and Albert have been faithfully teaching the Word of God in the services and the church overall is doing well. I recently met a pastor from Canada who told me a man from Kumasi had recently begun attending his church. He said that the man's wife, Fransisca, and daughter, Gloriland, were still living in Kumasi. He was able to get me their contact information and the men of our church were able to reach out to her. A few Sundays ago, she came from a good distance away with her daughter to visit the church. She said that she liked it very much and plans to attend again in the future. Pray that we can have the opportunity to fully preach the gospel to her.

Alex recently told me that he received a phone call from a man who had read one of the gospel tracts that we regularly pass out. The man said that he saw the tract lying on the ground and he picked it up and read the entire thing. He told Alex that he is a Seventh Day Adventist and that he had never heard the gospel so clearly explained as it was in our tract. He is away from Kumasi at the present time, but he has promised to come visit the church upon his return. Please pray that he will come and that he will be open to hearing more about eternal life. When Alex told me this, he was so excited to see that the gospel tracts we are distributing are yielding fruit. I am so thankful for this bit of encouragement for Alex and the rest of the church. We must not forget that every seed that is sown has the potential to yield abundant fruit!

We would appreciate your continued prayers for our family, not only for our upcoming travels, but also for some personal matters. Please pray for Kelly as her health is still sometimes up and down. Also we have an unspoken prayer request for one of our children concerning some spiritual issues. Pray also for the church people in Kumasi as they continue the work of preaching the gospel. They are a faithful group of people and they are enduring hardness in order to serve the Lord. As always we are thankful for each and every one of you and for your care for our family and the ministry in Ghana. God bless you as you serve Him.
