We know that going somewhere new on a Sunday often involves some anxiety. To help you relax and enjoy the service, we suggest the following:

SUNDAY SERVICES

Our services are normally about 75 minutes long and involve worship in song, prayer, and teaching from the Bible. Most of our people stand with the worship team when we sing, but we encourage you to enter into worship in whatever posture is comfortable for you.

We offer care and classes for 6 months - 5th grade in the morning services and 6 months - 5 years old in the evening service. Children are always welcome in worship, too. There is a Cry Room in the back if you'd like privacy for nursing or your little one needs some wiggle space.
