WHAT DID WE LEARN?

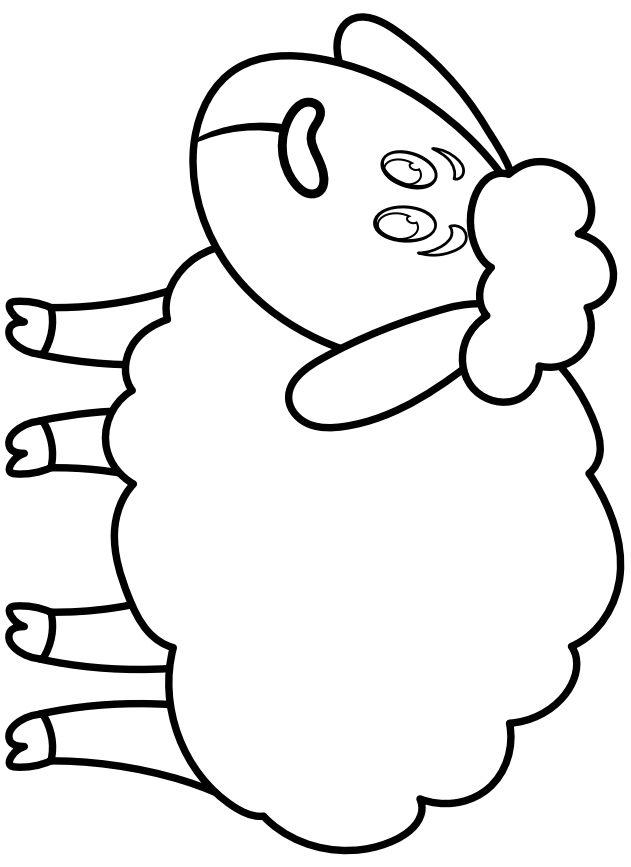
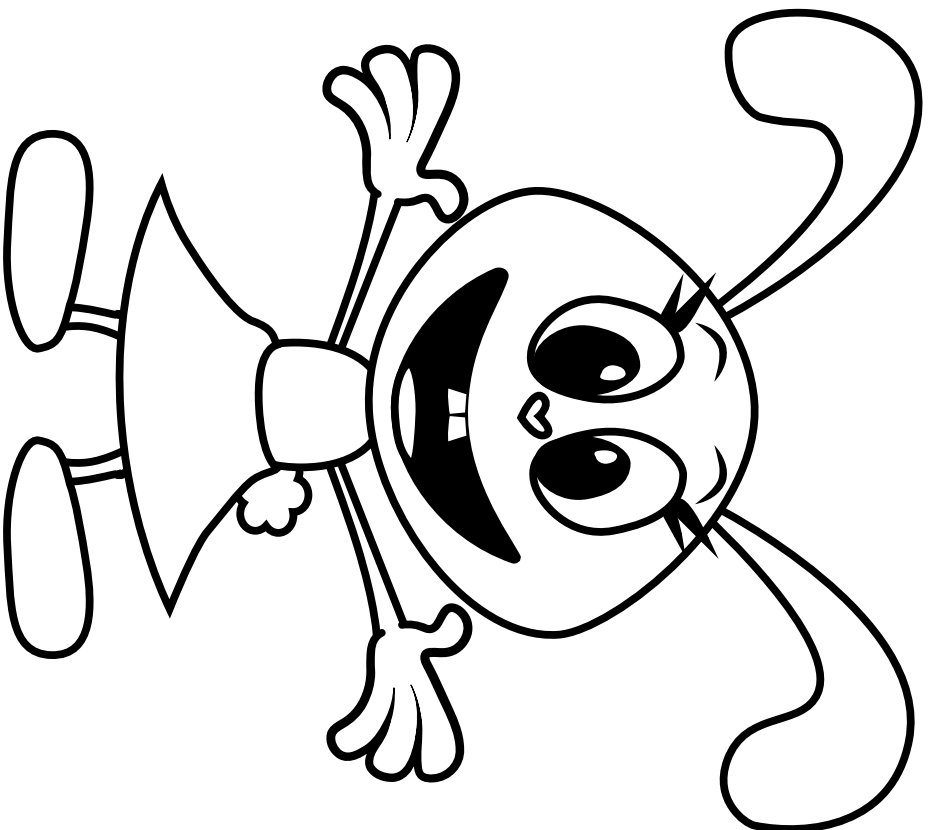
- Sheep wander, and sometimes people wander too.
- We can wander away from God by making wrong choices, by ignoring Him, or by thinking we know better than He does.
- But here's the good news: when we wander away, God doesn't forget about us.
- Jesus told us that the shepherd didn't say, "Oh well, I still have 99 sheep." He went looking for the one that was lost. And when he found it, he was filled with joy!
- That's how much God cares about each one of us. Every person matters to Him.
- So when you feel far away from God, remember that you are never forgotten.
- Jesus is the Good Shepherd who loves His sheep, comes looking for the lost, and rejoices when they are found.
- Because Jesus has found us, we can also help others find their way back to Him.
