



LETTERS TO THE CHURCH [ROMANS 4]

As we reflect on Romans 4 together, this is an opportunity to move beyond simply understanding the text and into living it out as a community. Abraham's story invites us to wrestle with faith, identity, and what it truly means to belong to God's family. Use these questions to listen well to one another, challenge assumptions, and encourage deeper trust in God's grace. Make space for honesty, curiosity, and prayer as you walk through this together.

Discussion Questions

1. What is a family trait that you cherish the most from your family of origin or your immediate family?
2. What do you believe are some modern day sticking points for us today in the American church that threaten our unity? (examples from the Church in Rome: superior morality complex, reliance on the the law for salvation, identity markers (circumcision), and pride of heritage).
3. How do we overcome both the old traps and the seemingly new traps together?
4. What have you enjoyed most about being a church of House churches? (Leaders please catalog answers and give them to Zack Gregor so he can inform Zach Day for advertising purposes :)
5. What do you find most remarkable about our father Abraham?
6. Are there any points of confusion from Romans 4 remaining for you?
7. How are you feeling led to respond to what you've read in Romans 4, from the message and from our discussion?
