### **Giving Up Bread**

The season of Lent has arrived, and it was observed well at Wesley. Throughout the day there was an opportunity for you to receive the imposition of ashes both here at church and outside. Hundreds of you took advantage of the experience in our Celebration Space and elsewhere; I am grateful to Kate Morris who made possible this contemplative and interactive time which everyone appreciated. The Ash Wednesday service at 7pm was as beautiful and moving as any I have ever observed. The music was powerful in its depth and richness, and the room, cast in purple light cloaked in darkness, shared what only words would be at a loss to convey. These 40 days are not just any time and this is not just another experience - this is Lent. First, a word of appreciation to Jeff Wickell, Elaine Maxwell and our choir, who provided such a profound experience as we enter into this sacred season. There is much more in store for these coming weeks, and you will not want to miss any of it.

And as to Lent - I have made my annual vow to give up bread. You know - that thing I do every year and fail miserably in my resolve. I am happy to report, now deep into this time (36 hours), I have not had a bite of bread. Not that I haven't already encountered temptation. No sooner had I begun my vow than did a box of Hero's Donuts arrive to the church. At first I rationalized. I mean, I had only vowed to give up bread (you know, the loaf kind); surely donuts are an entirely different culinary species than bread. I knew immediately that such logic would not fly. Then I thought, well, really donuts are much more a member of the cake family than bread family, and I had said nothing about giving up cake. Again, honest reflection prevented me from making such a moral argument.

When in such a dilemma it is good to seek the counsel of others so I asked the staff what I should do. Lindsey said, "You know Lent doesn't officially start until after the service at 7:00." While I appreciated the sentiment, I am not sure to what liturgical calendar she was referring. No, I'm stuck, though I will tell you it is easier to resist the one remaining day-old donut than the ones delivered freshly yesterday.

That is the point, you understand. The season of Lent is not an exercise in simple self-improvement. It is true: I could stand to lose 10 pounds (okay, 15 or 20); still you get my point. The purpose of Lent is to say that going your own way doesn't get you where you want to go. Lent interrupts our journey and if we let it, resets our course. I once thought that my reluctance to confront temptation was that it would reveal my weakness. I know now it reveals my desires. Most of what is temptation is really chaff - distraction from what I know I really want and for certain what I need. You will not find this guidance anywhere other than in prayer and at church. I look forward to seeing you Sunday on our journey that when done well arrives at Easter.



### **OUR WEEKLY BREAD**


It's the beginning of Lent, a 40-day time of repentance. But to focus only on repentance is to miss what the season really can offer. It's so much more than a period of groveling for how low we are as sinners. It's more about renewal and preparation than repentance. It's a time to sweep away the cobwebs - to let the distractions of life be purposely removed. It involves an introspective gaze toward the actions, emotions and thoughts that keep us from experiencing Christ-likeness, but that doesn't mean we should walk around depressed for 40 days.

Scripturally, repentance shows a very different reaction than groveling and depression. Sure, there is an awareness of the sin and the barrier that it creates between us and God, but the awareness is there to lead us to restoration. Many people miss this important piece of repentance. They repent of something and then continue to feel bad about what they had done, or how they had let God and others down. The problem with that thinking is that it's not at all how Jesus saw repentance!

Jesus told the woman caught in adultery that she wasn't condemned. Instead of shunning the tax collectors, Jesus ate with them and celebrated their turning. The sick he healed, the possessed he freed, the children he blessed and the widows he embraced. Jesus believed that heaven rejoiced when sinners repented. And his largest words of criticism were for the religious folks who paraded their piety. Jesus rejoiced when the lost were found - he threw parties for those who found redemption. Repentance leads to renewal.

That's what Lent is - a time to begin preparations. It's a season of renewal and a time to sit still and reflect. What is clogging up your life - your mind, body, soul - from truly being prepared to see Jesus? What is distracting you and causing life to become out of focus? What could you strip away so that you could experience renewal this Lenten season?
