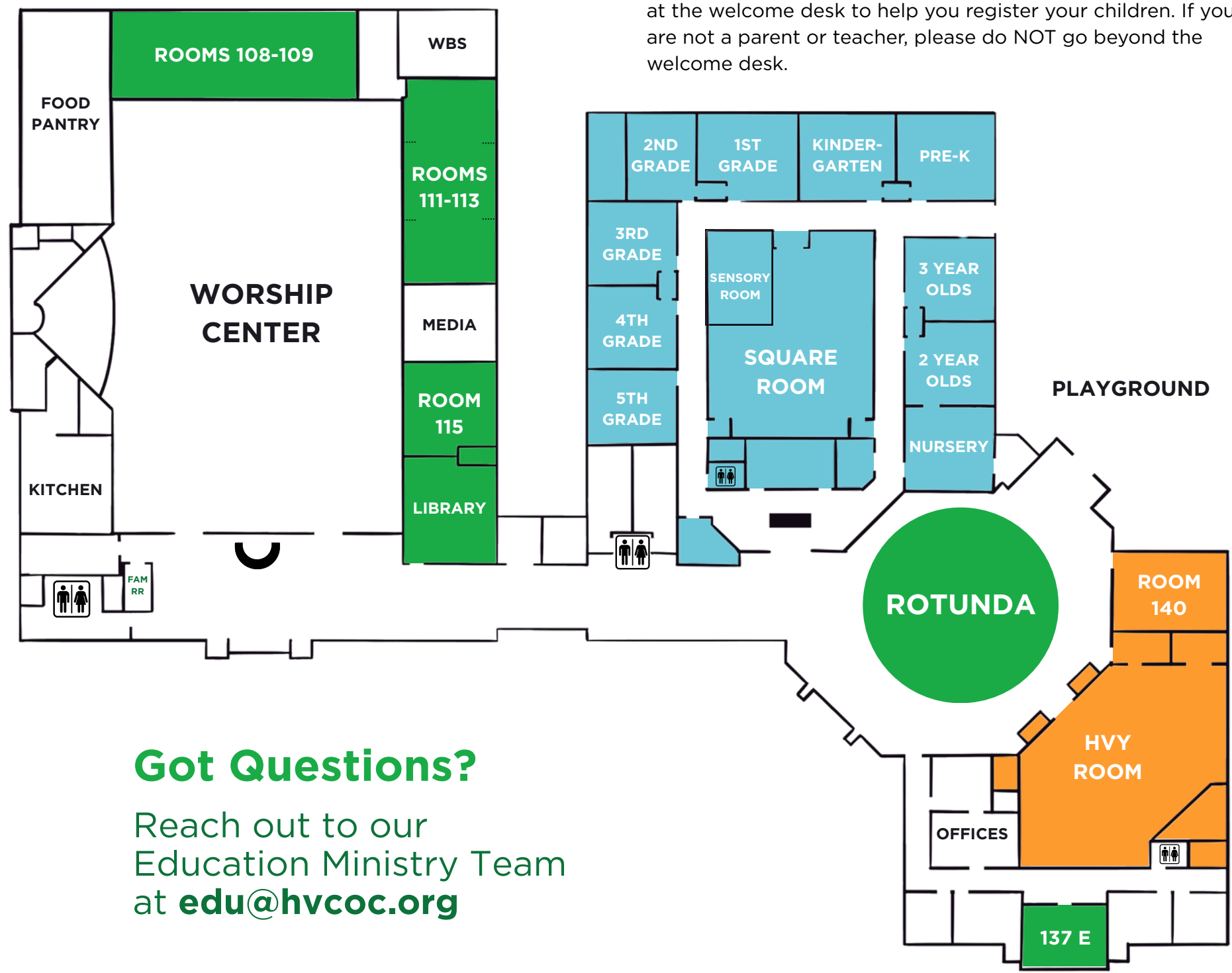

Class Descriptions

Sunday

Exodus - II

This quarter we will continue our journey through the story of Exodus. We will explore how God shepherds His newly-liberated children into an understanding of what their freedom means: lives consecrated for service to God and to one another. And with fresh perspective, ask what these stories teach God’s children today about how to live as those set free through Christ.

The Bible - What is it?

This class - part of our Christian Foundations track- will feature a monthly rotation designed to provide basic information about our faith and its practice. A different teacher takes it up each month, and the monthly topics combine to give an overview of Christianity and enable further study. This August, Christian Foundations opens with a four-week look at the book at the center of the Christian faith, starting from the ground up, with nothing assumed. Whether you’ve read the Bible for years or have never opened one, we ask a single question: What actually is this book? In September, we turn from what the Bible is to the who the bible is about: Jesus Christ. We will meet Jesus through the four Gospels — Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John — as four witnesses describing one person from four angles. In October, Daniel Brooks leads us into “quiet times” — what to do with your time with God, and how to build a habit of engaging him. All are welcome; come as you are.

Parenting Class

We are now in a world where knowledge, learning, and information have become readily available to everyone. We are “parenting” in that world. Are the rules different? We present a biblical framework for parenting in the modern age through the perspectives of three sets of parents currently in the trenches.

Genesis - I

The Bible is the greatest story ever told. Genesis sets the stage for the rest of the story. Genesis is not only the first book of the Bible, but it is also the template and lens through which the rest of scripture is understood. Genesis was written in a historical and cultural setting that answered questions important to the original hearers and that remain relevant today. The historical accounts recorded in Genesis are so rich that it is easy to stay on the surface and never slow down to ask deeper questions. This class will dive deeper into the text, asking some of these questions, and exploring the arrangement and choice of words that deepen our understanding of what the Spirit is telling us through the historical accounts of God’s chosen people.

I & II Peter

We often remember Peter as portrayed in the Gospels, but he matures into an early leader of the church in Jerusalem. Joins us as we informally review and discuss the writings of I & II Peter – the elder and the leader

Life & Writings of Paul - III

Saul, also known as Paul and the Apostle to the Gentiles, is the most prominent character subject in the book of Acts and the most prolific writer of letters in the New Testament. In this study, we will follow Paul through the book of Acts, utilizing The Visual Bible’s word-for-word (NIV) visual dramatization of The Book of Acts. We will tie in the main teachings of Paul in his letters in chronological order where they fit into his journeys in the book of Acts and beyond. In the first two parts we have followed Paul through his conversion and his three missionary journeys, including his writings to the Churches in Galatia, Thessalonica, Corinth, and Rome, and to his arrest in Jerusalem. In Part 3 we will follow Paul in chains to Caesarea, Rome, and beyond and look at his prison and pastoral epistles. Come and experience what Paul has to say to churches and his co-missionaries in their historical and chronological context and discover their application to us today.

Introduction to American Sign Language

Come and learn American Sign Language - this quarter, the Beginner and Intermediate classes will be combined.
