

FAMILY CONNECTION

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE | John 2:1-11

SESSION SUMMARY

While Jesus's baptism marked the beginning of His earthly ministry, this week's passage brings us to Jesus's first miracle: turning the water into wine at a wedding. Six stone jars that usually held water for ceremonial washing became six stone jars filled to the brim with what wedding guests described as the finest wine served at the event. In this session, we see that Jesus meets our needs to help us see Him and know Him. Here are the main points:

- Jesus provides something better (John 2:1-8).
- Jesus's miracles reveal His identity (John 2:9-11).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- When have we tried to grow a skill or change a habit and stuck with it? When have we not stuck with it? Why?
- Why is it important for our family to know and trust that Jesus does more than change us—He makes us new?
- How has Jesus worked in our family's life, in both big and small but undeniable ways?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Write out "I need God's work in . . ." on a sticky note, and stick it to the middle of your table. Give each family member a small scrap sheet of paper. Invite each person to write out the area of life where he or she feels the biggest need for God to work. Place the scrap sheets of paper around the statement in the middle of the table. Ask each person to pray for the person on his or her right, that God would work in the specific area mentioned.
