LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear SMBC Family,

Grace and peace to you in the mighty name of our Lord Jesus Christ! As we prepare to observe Men's Day, we pause to give thanks for the faithful witness, labor, and leadership of the men among us. In the life of the African American Church, Men's Day is more than a calendar event, it is a testimony. It is a declaration that, in a world that has too often mischaracterized, marginalized, and misunderstood Black men, God has sustained, strengthened, and sanctified them for sacred service. We honor fathers, grandfathers, sons, brothers, mentors, and spiritual leaders who stand as pillars in the house of God and in the heart of our community.

From the hush harbors of our ancestors to the storefront sanctuaries and established congregations of today, Black men have carried both burden and blessing. They have worked long hours and still found strength to serve. They have faced systems designed to diminish them, yet they have prayed, persevered, and pressed forward. In the home, they are protectors and providers; in the community, they are advocates and examples; in the church, they are worshiper and workers. Their strength is not merely physical, it is spiritual. It is the quiet resolve to love their families well, to discipline with dignity, to lead with humility, and to bow before Christ even while standing tall before the world.

Yet we celebrate not a myth of perfection, but the miracle of perseverance. The strength of Black men is not found in never struggling, it is found in rising again and again by the grace of God. In Jesus Christ, we see the ultimate model of manhood: courageous yet compassionate, strong yet sacrificial, authoritative yet obedient to the Father. As our men follow Christ, they shape homes that are rooted in love and communities that are anchored in hope. And when Black men are spiritually grounded, families flourish, and neighborhoods are fortified.

So, on this Men's Day, let us affirm, encourage, and uplift the men among us. Let us pray for their protection, their mental and emotional wellness, their economic stability, and their spiritual growth. And let us remember that when God strengthens our men, He strengthens our entire village. May this celebration renew our commitment to stand together - women and men, young and seasoned - building homes, raising children, and transforming communities for the glory of Christ and the good of generations to come.

GUEST PREACHER REV. AMIN T. FLOWERS

With Luke 1:37 ("With God all things are possible") as his motto, it's no surprise that Pastor Amin Terrell Flowers has lived his life as a visionary who refuses to be limited by man's expectations. Equipped with a winning attitude and charismatic personality, he has faced life's obstacles head-on, knowing God is his source and strength.

The only child in the marriage union of Flander and Emma Flowers, Pastor Flowers was born and raised in Baltimore, Maryland. He attended the Baltimore Catholic School System. Upon graduating from high school, he continued on to Virginia Union University, where he majored in Religion and Philosophy with a minor in History. While at Virginia Union, Pastor Flowers was impacted by the strong sense of a religious obligation to give more to God. It was at this time that he accepted his call to ministry. After graduating, he attended The Samuel D. Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union. In 2003, Rev. Flowers received his Master of Divinity.

He then went on to serve as a Youth Pastor for various ministries before stepping out on faith in 2006 to found LIFE Church Ministries in Baltimore, MD. He is a powerful revivalist, preacher, teacher, and motivational speaker, but, most importantly, he is a believer. He travels throughout the country empowering, inspiring, and motivating God's people through His Word.

In 2018, Pastor Flowers was accepted into the Doctoral program at Evangelical Seminary in Myerstown, PA. He is currently pursuing a Doctoral degree in Theology focusing on Organizational Leadership. Pastor Flowers is the proud husband to the former Adrienne Carey, a University of Maryland Medical School graduate. They have two children, Amin Isaiah Flowers II and Alexandria Emma Flowers. He is also a proud member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.
