SERVING IN WEAKNESS / TRUSTING IN CHRIST

It is a joy to have finally arrived in North Platte! As I write this on Thursday, I will be installed on this coming Sunday. I'm excited to begin a new chapter together!

As some of you know, shortly after arriving we got sick which slowed the unpacking boxes and altered some early plans for getting set up in the office. My son Christopher went to the emergency room in the middle of Sunday night with severe flu symptoms. While that was not how I envisioned starting our ministry together, the Lord gently reminded me of the Apostle Paul's words to the Corinthians – *"I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling"* (1 Corinthians 2:3).

Paul did not begin his ministry among them from a position of visible strength, but in weakness. And yet it was precisely through that weakness that Christ's power was made known. Our confidence is never in our own stamina, plans, or abilities, but in the Spirit who works through the Word.

Though I would have preferred to start at full strength, perhaps this beginning is its own quiet sermon – Christ builds his Church not through human strength, but through his gracious and powerful presence. Even when the pastor is sick and tired, even when the boxes remain half-unpacked, even when bodies are weak — the Word of the Lord is not bound.

Thank you for your patience and prayers as I recover and continue settling in. I look forward to visiting with you in your homes, learning your stories, and serving you in the name of Christ. What a privilege it is to walk together in faith — not in our strength, but in his!

Approval of minutes: Glenn Van Velson moved that the minutes of the January 12TH Elders meeting be approved. After receiving a second, the motion was approved by voice vote.

Unfinished business:

Jim informed the Elders that the Education Committee has set the time for Sunday School at 9 AM starting on March 1st..

Jim informed the Elders that there has been a motion sensor, for the light, installed in the north entry vestibule, and Ruth Chadwick expressed her appreciation.

The status of the church key, held by Pastor Deardoff, was tabled pending additional information.

Additional security options for Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church (BSLC) were discussed. The topic was tabled pending additional information from Mike Steele.

The meal preceding the Lenten Service, March 4TH, will be furnished and served by the Elders. It will consist of chili soup and cinnamon rolls. Jim Parish, Al Huff, and John Flynn will each provide a roaster full of chili soup. Jeff Boeke will acquire cinnamon rolls from Cash-wa Distributing.

New business:

Daniel and Aimee Roehrs have requested a transfer of membership to Zion Lutheran in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Leland Poppe moved that we grant the transfer. After receiving a second, the motion was approved by voice vote.

A report on the official acts of 2025, provided by the church office, was reviewed.

The service held at Linden Court has been held on the first Tuesday of the past few months. Pastor Ramsey has requested that the service be moved to the third Tuesday of the month. The consensus of the Elders was that would be fine, but there may be changes again, once Pastor Hahn has a chance to develop his schedule at BSLC.

The details of the installation service, set for February 22ND, were discussed. Early estimates have gone as high as 200 attendees. After the February 15TH deadline for registration comes, we should have a better estimate. John Flynn will purchase beef brisket from Cash-wa Distributing. John and Rod Christmann will smoke some pork loin. Jeff Boeke will acquire dinner rolls. Al Huff and Jim Parish will provide green beans. The Lutheran Women in Mission, of BSLC, have volunteered to provide desserts.

Pastor Hahn has informed Leland Poppe that his house in Illinois sold after being on the market for one day. The closing is set for later in February. Glenn Van Velson moved that, upon repayment, the money provided to Pastor Hahn for a bridge loan be reinvested in the same banks that it was pulled from. After receiving a second, the motion was approved by voice vote.

Allen Huff moved that the meeting be adjourned. Agreement was by consensus.

Jim adjourned the meeting at 8:13, followed by the Lord's Prayer being recited.

Beautiful Savior Council Meeting February 15, 2026

Mike Steele called meeting to order at 2:01

Pastor Hahn opened with prayer.

Minutes:

Andrew Van Velson moved and 2nd by Charlene Schneider to approve last council minutes from October as presented. Motion carried

Treasurer's Report:

Charlene presented Treasurer's Report. Pastor Hahn will reimburse Beautiful Savior when he closes on his other house for the money we loaned him. Mike has been going through the by-laws and what reports we need financially. He will work with Charlene to get the reports adjusted and balanced to get the reports back out. Andrew Van Velson moved to approve treasurer's report and 2nd by Leland Poppe. Motion carried.

Board of Elders – Been coordinating the installation program and Lenten services. Going through list of members and updating addresses. Discussion about lighting and security in the nursery area. Update the motion light outside the south door. May want to look at starting over with the locks and keys since so many people have keys to the church and trying to get keys from former pastors. Do we need a policy for having keys. May want to discuss with Trustees and Elders. It was suggested at having a magnetic lock push button release system with camera and connected to Ruth's phone. Mike will get a quote on a magnetic release for the doors so the church can be locked at all times at least the door to the preschool. Transferred Daniel and Aimie Roehrs out. Discussed the service at Linden Court. It has been a benefit to the people at Linden Court. Elders are working on installation details. Installation is Sunday February 22nd and Elders will prepare brisket and pork loins for the meal. Discussed putting together a new photo directory and are working on how to proceed with that.

Mike suggested that we should have all worship team people, music people, screen people, Ruth and pastor working together so all are on the same page.

Trustees – No report

Board of Ed - Discussed that Sunday School will be at 9:00 a.m. Since Easter is coming up, Easter lessons will start. Preschool will have open house on February 20th. There are limited spaces open in preschool coming up this next year. Karyn Tallman and Ruth will help Gwen with that. Working on VBS and deciding whether to have VBS in the evening or not and need to set up a meeting to discuss this. Kim Utecht is head of the Board. Looking at possibly having a date set in July not June when Nebraskaland Days is going on. Too many activities in June to have VBS. Participation will be better if VBS is scheduled later. Board looks at when other VBS's start in North Platte so Beautiful Savior can schedule theirs. Beautiful Savior is usually the last to set a date for VBS. Date has not been set yet. Ashley will check with Our Redeemer to see if they are having VBS. Beautiful Savior Board of Ed has been working with Our Redeemer's Board of Ed and that relationship is going very well. We gave Our Redeemer \$3300 for scholarships not tuition. Our Redeemer is asking Beautiful Savior to help with fundraising for the school.

The Board of Ed is looking at their budget that could possibly help financially with hiring a floating para for Our Redeemer school. Ron Asher stated that there is a tax credit donation program available to help. Our Redeemer is also updating their curriculum as it has not been updated for quite some time. They will put in a request to the congregation for donations for Our Redeemer school.

Mike asked elders about having a joint service this summer with Our Redeemer which will be held on the fifth Sunday in May. Pastor Ramsey contacted Pastor Hahn to preach that Sunday of which Pastor Hahn is agreeable.

Pastor John has indicated that he did not want to be paid for his sermon last Sunday, just consider it donated time. Suggested to donate the money to Our Redeemer School.

Discussed Confirmation and suggested that we have a reception here for the Confirmands even though the students are being confirmed at Our Redeemer. Confirmation is scheduled for Reformation Sunday in October. There are 3 Confirmands from Beautiful Savior with a total of 10 Confirmands. Pastor Ramsey does a very good job of helping the Confirmands understanding what they are getting confirmed for and communion, etc. Maybe the Elders will do a questionnaire as in the past with the Confirmands and then have a reception for those Confirmands from Beautiful Savior. Pastor Hahn has been in contact with Pastor Ramsey about curriculum and how to handle Confirmation between the two churches this year.

Board of Outreach – No report – Need to know what their intent is on whether to continue.

Board of Youth – No report

Planning Committee - Plan for this group is to meet after the next council meeting. Talked about by-laws. Objective to coordinate the mission of our church. Open to interpretation. Mike is asking one board member from each board and come to council and present some of things we want to tackle and have some sort of formal agenda to meet to bring before the voters meeting in April. Planning Committee needs to meet more often than just once a year. Next voters meeting will be held April 19th at 2:00 p.m. No Council in April.

Boards Planning Session - Documents will be printed out by Ruth. By-Laws were handed out and what the boards are and explained what they are responsible for. Boards need to get their meeting dates to Ruth and on the Church Calendar ahead of time.

Need to review Board of Outreach and whether they want to continue or replace it. There are 3 members and need to know their intent.

New Business: 2025-2026 Officers and Board Members list was handed out and reviewed. Bob Lantis has volunteered to help with call committee for officers. Melissa Spearman is not on Board of Ed any longer as they have moved. Think of people willing to put their names on the ballots.

We have done nothing with furniture in the Pastor's office. Pastor Hahn would like to have a 4-foot round table with chairs around it versus a regular desk. Will work with Trustees to identify an appropriate table. Andrew Van Velson moved and 2nd by Charlene to purchase a table for Pastor's office as deemed an appropriate cost. Motion carried.

Andrew Van Velson elected Pastor Hahn for Pastoral delegate and he accepted. Motion by Andrew VanVelson to have Pastor Hahn as our pastoral delegate, 2nd by Charlene Schneider. Motion carried. Leland Poppe nominated Glen Van Velson if he accepts as our lay delegate 2nd by Charlene Schneider. Motion carried.

Table Items - Need to clean up by-laws language and have summary of those items ready for March council meeting and April voters meeting. Discussed what is needed for a quorum to change By-Laws or capital improvements for voters' meetings. Right now, the quorum is 30% of approximately 127 voters. We averaged 50 to 60 people in attendance for our call meetings which is half of the 30%. This item needs to be amended. Discussed counting everyone in attendance including children, but voting members should be 18 to vote. Would it be a percentage of worship attendance? Voting should be based on worship members counted attending as voting members.

Fifth Sunday in May which is May 31st will have joint Worship Service with Our Redeemer and decide and if we want to have it held outside or inside. Joint Service was held last year at Mid Plains College outside Pavilion with a meal provided afterward. If we have inclement weather the college has a gym or activities center we could use.

With no further business, Andrew Van Velson moved to adjourn meeting. Motion carried.


