*“He is not here, for he has risen, as he said.” (Matthew 28:6)*

These words, spoken by the angel at the empty tomb, are not just a message for that first Easter morning—they are God’s living and active promise for you and me today. In a world where so much feels broken, uncertain, and weary, this good news meets us right where we are: Jesus is alive.

There are times when life feels anything but new. We carry burdens that seem too heavy, regrets that linger too long, and fears that whisper too loudly. We see decay, loss, and death around us—and within us. We may even wonder if real, lasting change is possible.

But the empty tomb declares something greater than our doubts: death does not get the final word.

Jesus did not merely survive death—he defeated it. And he did this not as a distant miracle, but for you. His resurrection is God’s promise that sin is forgiven, guilt is removed, and death has been overcome. What once held us captive no longer has power over us.

This means that new life is not just a future hope—it begins now. In Christ, you are not defined by your past, your failures, or your fears. You are made new. His life becomes your life. His victory becomes your victory.

And this life is not temporary. The risen Jesus gives a life that cannot be taken away—a life that stretches beyond the grave into eternity. For those who feel worn down, empty, or overwhelmed, this is the hope that does not disappoint: because he lives, you also will live.

So when the days feel heavy, return to the empty tomb. Hear again the angel’s words. Let them echo into your heart and your circumstances:

He is not here.

He is risen.

And because he lives, you have life—new, abundant, and eternal!

### **Approval of minutes**

Glenn Van Velson moved that the minutes of the February 9<sup>TH</sup> Elders meeting be approved. After receiving a second, the motion was passed by voice vote.

### **Reports**

Pastor Hahn discussed some verses from 1 Corinthians chapter 3, then presented his March 2026 Pastor's Report. The report details some of the services, activities, meetings, and visitations that Pastor participated in during the past month. The report also has information on the District Pastor's Conference that will be held, mid-April, in Kearney. Some details of worship services, service times and dates were discussed by the group at this time. (See the bullet point on Holy Week Services, in New Business.)

### **Unfinished Business**

Security follow up—Nothing new to report. Still waiting on additional information from contacts of Mike Steele.

Directory Update/Photo Directory—Different ideas on how to get members of Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church (BSLC) to sit for pictures were discussed. Graphic databases and ways to get a directory published were discussed. Staying in house as much as possible seems like the quickest and most acceptable way to go. Tim Wilcox did a great job taking pictures three years ago, and Leland Poppe has taken some good pictures at events in the past. Thoughts are to approach them about taking some of the pictures again.

### **New business**

Sign on the north side—Discussion was held on the location of a key for the sign. The letters have been located, but no key. A ring of old keys was handed off to Pastor Hahn, Al Huff will try them on Tuesday.

More discussion about what should be displayed on the sign took place.

Holy Week Services—There will be Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services at 6:15 PM. Easter morning there will be only one service, held at 10:00 AM.

Ad in the Newspaper for Holy Week services—There was discussion but no action was taken.

Easter Morning Breakfast? — There will not be a breakfast planned for Easter morning.

Spring Voters Meeting— The voter's meeting is set for April 19<sup>TH</sup>. Bob Lantis has developed a short list of individuals who are willing to serve as Elder if elected. Three positions will need to be filled.

Introducing Pastor Hahn to the Community—There was discussion on how much exposure is achieved from media events such as Mugs in the Morning, Facebook, Newsmakers, interviews on KJLT, and an article in the newspaper. Things seem to point to social media giving the most exposure. No immediate action was taken.

Joint Worship Service with Our Redeemer—It has been set for May 31<sup>ST</sup>, to be held at the commons shelter on the Mid-Plains Community College south campus.

Wednesdays after Lent— There was a consensus of opinion that we should continue with the evening services on Wednesday. Sticking with the current times of 5 PM for supper and 6:15 for the service.

April the 8<sup>TH</sup> will be the first Wednesday after Holy Week.

### **Adjournment**

Bob Lantis moved that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded and passed on a voice vote.

Jim Parish adjourned the meeting at 8:45 PM, at which time the Lord's Prayer was recited.

President Mike Steele called mtg to order at 2:00 p.m.

Pastor Hahn opened sharing scripture from Proverbs 3: 5-6. Main theme was keeping Christ first in our lives and then had prayer.

Everyone introduced themselves to Pastor Hahn and what position they held in the church.

**Minutes:** Charlene Schneider motioned to accept minutes as presented and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ashley Roehrs. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report:** Charlene Schneider reported on treasurer's report. Dedicated funds not included.

Mike made comment that historically our expenses are greater than income. But we have always filled those needs. In the past, we have steered away from stewardship. What is Pastor Hahn's stance on Stewardship. Stewardship is a broad word for management of all our gifts and overall ministry. Pastor will address this issue with a survey. There is no need to discuss stewardship right away. We have met the budget. There may be an adjustment in family giving each year. Two things to look at in the beginning of the year is cost of insurance and electronic giving. We need to consider giving electronically so when congregation members are not here for worship they need not worry about their offering every Sunday. Sub Splash and Joyful Response is our giving on-line. Electronic giving is not for everyone but gives people the option. Suggested putting a note in newsletter and bulletin giving a gentle reminder to congregation that they can give on-line and how to do it. Suggested that Beautiful Savior President encourage the congregation on electronic giving.

**Board of Elders** – Glen gave report on Elders. Met last week and discussed conduct of worship with Pastor and communion practices. It was suggested to have children's sermon every Sunday. Discussed the Wednesday evening services at 6:15 – 7 even when Lent is over. After Easter, worship services will continue Wednesday's. May need to work on finding musicians for Wednesday services. There will be Bible Study and Confirmation classes following worship service on Wednesdays. Easter Sunday will be held at 10:00 a.m., but no breakfast. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services will be held at regular times. Discussed that meals will only be provided on Wednesdays during confirmation season and not during the whole year. Question is whether confirmation will be held here or Our Redeemer. But the plan is to bring Confirmation back to our church now that we have a pastor. Pastor's plan for Confirmation is two 9-week terms with nothing in December or school breaks. Comment to Elders is that we need to look into having words from hymnal match the screen. Pastor will check with Ruth on wording and coordinate with Rebecca. Discussed having congregation photos taken again and how to accomplish this. Possibly asking Tim Wilcox if he can do it again and when he is available.

**Trustees – No Report**

**Board of Ed** – Decided to use VBS curriculum from Group with Rain Forest as the theme which was ordered last week. VBS will be held from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. with meals being served at 5:00 p.m. before VBS starts. Younger kids could be dismissed earlier but need to discuss this further. Discussed not having pre-printed T-shirts and just having iron on message. It was suggested that we have a plain white shirt and have kids sign them. They have asked for donations for T-shirts as well. Suggested to have a shirt that has Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church on it. It was suggested we could have a QR code on the shirts. Our Redeemer hired a kindergarten teacher and is trying to hire another teacher.
