## WORSHIPPING WITH OUR CHILDREN

All Saints Day is always the first Sunday in November when we remember and honor all of those who have died with faith in Jesus and are now with Him in heaven. The word "saint" comes from a Latin word meaning "holy" or "sacred". Saints are God's holy people. All of God's faithful people are His saints – everyone who believes in Jesus as their Savior from sin! Jesus is the one who makes us holy! Jesus is the one who makes us a saint!




