STATION 1

Check-In Activities: **Large Wooden Blocks & Fidget Toys**

Memory Verse: **Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. Deuteronomy 6:4-5**

Big Idea: **God takes care of us, so we should remember the many things He has done.**

Bible Passage: **The Book of Deuteronomy, Deuteronomy 32:7**

TEN COMMANDMENTS GAME (for younger kids)

Say: **Moses told the Israelites to remember the special rules that God wanted them to live by. Most of these rules came from the 10 Commandments. Do you know any of the 10 Commandments? (Kids respond.) Let's find out by playing a little game!**

Directions: **Have the kids sit in the chairs. Split the kids into 2 teams. Give each kid from both teams a number 1-6 (if there are more than 12 kids you can make 3 teams). If the dice rolls their number they will race up to the front and have a chance to tell you one if they think this is one of the 10 Commandments.**

If they get it right, their team gets a point. If not, the other team member has a chance to answer for a point. Keep rolling the dice until you've gone through all the questions.

- 1. Do not steal. (Yes)**
- 2. No other God besides God. (Yes)**
- 3. Do not cheat. (No)**
- 4. Do not hit. (No)**
- 5. Do not make idols. (Yes)**
- 6. Wash your hands before you eat. (No)**
- 7. Do not say God's name in a bad way. (Yes)**
- 8. Honor your father and mother. (Yes)**
- 9. Trust in God always. (No)**
- 10. Do not lie. (Yes)**
- 11. Say your prayers. (No)**
- 12. Be kind to the poor. (No)**
- 13. Do not murder. (Yes)**
- 14. Do not waste food. (No)**
- 15. Keep the Sabbath Day holy. (Yes)**
- 16. Do not covet. (Yes)**

Nice work! God wanted the Israelites to remember the 10 Commandments because He knew that following these rules is the best way to live.

God also wanted everyone to know that the Israelites were special because they followed Him. By living differently from all of the other people, the Israelites would stand out big time! The other nations around them would see that the Israelites were living the best way and that God blessed them.

Check-In Activities: **Scratch Art & Noah's Ark**

Memory Verse: **Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. Deuteronomy 6:4-5**

Big Idea: **God takes care of us, so we should remember the many things He has done.**

Bible Passage: **The Book of Deuteronomy, Deuteronomy 32:7**

THE REMEMBERING RAINBOW (Application Activity)

Say: **In the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses wanted the Israelites to remember all that God did for them. We should still do this today! Let's play a game that will help us remember some of the things God has done for us.**

Directions: **Have the kids sit in a circle around the rug. Give each kid a small cup of Skittles®, but don't let them eat the candy yet. Each color of candy will correspond to a category (see below).**

Let the kids choose which color they want to eat first. Go around the circle, and for every kid who has that color, have them answer the corresponding question.

After each kid shares, they can eat that color of Skittles®! Repeat with the other colors.

PURPLE: What is something cool that God has done for you?

GREEN: What is something special that God has given you?

RED: What is one of God's rules that you need to remember the most?

ORANGE: What is something God did for the Israelites?

YELLOW: God has done all of these things for us. What is something we can do for God? (Have a friendship with Him, follow Him, obey His commands, etc.)

Check-In Activities: **Coloring Sheets**

Memory Verse: **Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. Deuteronomy 6:4-5**

Big Idea: **God takes care of us, so we should remember the many things He has done.**

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PRAYER STONES (Group Prayer Activity)

Directions: **Tell the kids in your group that stones were often used in the Bible as a reminder of how good and faithful God is.**

Give each of the kids in your group a small stone card and have them cut out each stone.

They are going to think of one word or picture that describes each of their prayers and write it down on their stone.

- **Think of one thing that God has done for you. How has God cared for you and given you all the things you need?**
- **Think of one thing they need prayer for. Or does someone else in their life need prayer?**
- **Think of one thing they're thankful for. What's one special thing that God has given you or done for you?**

For example, if they need help from God to get through a tough situation with a friend, they could write the word "friend" or draw their friend on their stone.

Be ready to help kids translate their prayer into a word or picture.

Go around the circle and have each kid show what they wrote on their stones. Let them explain their prayer request or praise.

When everyone has had a chance to write their one-word or picture prayers, have them place the stones in an envelope.

Afterwards, tell the kids to keep the stone in their pocket all week long. Anytime they reach in and feel the stone, they'll be reminded to bring their prayer request or praise to God.
