

## **Baby Dedication**

A Baby Dedication is a special time to pray and celebrate the gift of your child from God. Throughout Scripture, God's people have celebrated and blessed their children, recognizing that each child ultimately belongs to Him. During these moments, parents commit to honoring, following, and obeying God as they raise their child.

At Centerpoint Church, dedicating your child is a public commitment made before God, your family, and your church community. It is a promise to do your best to raise your child in a home that follows God and reflects His love.

## **Requirements for Baby Dedication**

Because of the significance of this commitment, the following requirements must be completed before scheduling a Baby Dedication:

1. Parents are married, as we believe marriage is between one man and one woman.
  2. A single parent may participate if they are living a life that honors God, including not living with a partner.
  3. Regular attendance at Centerpoint Church.
  4. Attend Baby Dedication Orientation

## **What to Expect**

Baby Dedications take place during Sunday services at 12:00 PM or 6:00 PM. Multiple families may participate in the same service.

The dedication includes:

- A public commitment by the parents to raise their child in a God-honoring home
- A prayer of dedication for the child, parents, and family

Each family will also receive a dedication certificate and a Beginner's Bible for their child.
