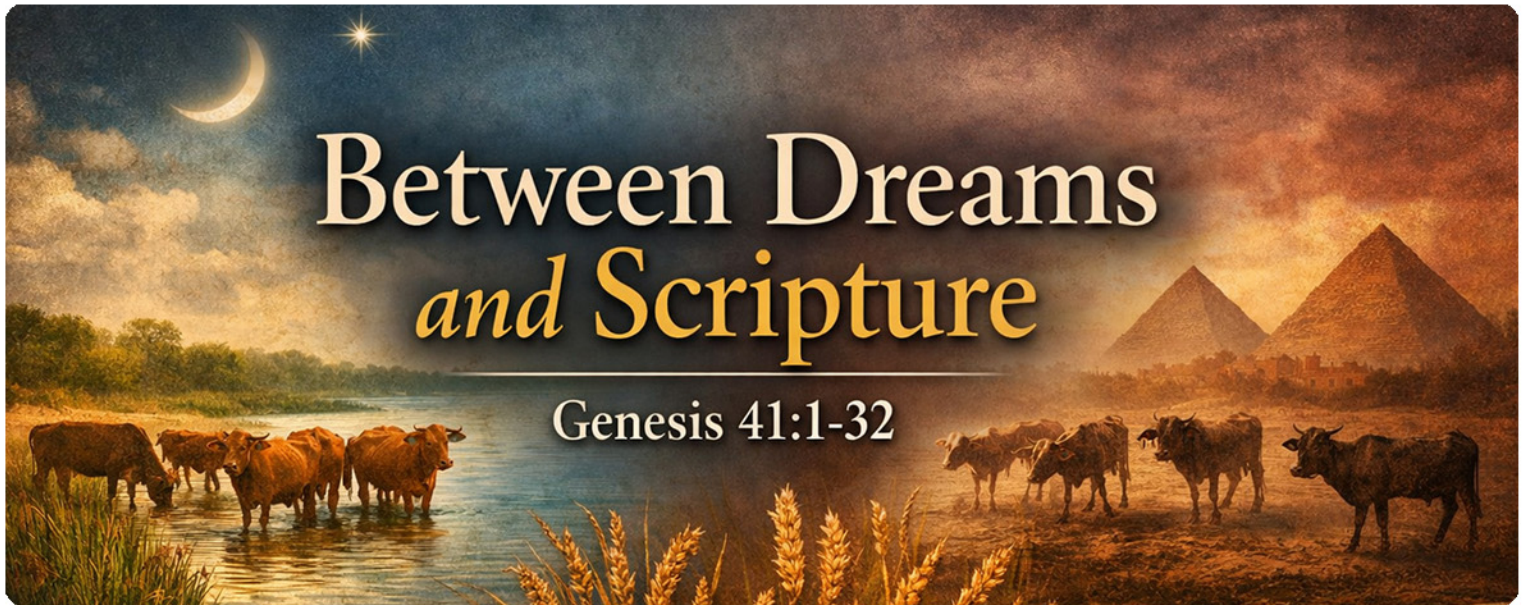

Questions for further Further Discussion: Read Genesis 39:6-20

Opening Reflection: What is your general experience with dreams? Do you tend to remember them, ignore them, or try to interpret them?

- 1) In Genesis 41, why do you think Pharaoh's dreams were so troubling to him? What made them different from ordinary dreams?
- 2) Looking at the examples mentioned in the sermon (Pharaoh, Joseph, Abimelech, etc.), what patterns do you see in why God uses dreams in Scripture?
- 3) Joseph says, *"It is not in me; God will give Pharaoh the answer."* What does this reveal about Joseph's character and his view of God?
- 4) Which of the four approaches to dreams that were presented by Pastor Chad (rejecting, cessationist, emphasizing, moderated) have you encountered before? Which one have you personally leaned toward—and why?

Between Dreams and Scripture

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- 5) **Read Ecclesiastes 5:3 and Jeremiah 23:25.** How do these passages help us think wisely about whether a dream is from God or not?
- 6) The sermon shared a personal story of a meaningful dream that brought encouragement. How should we process personal experiences like that without letting them override Scripture?
- 7) Why is it dangerous to let dreams guide our decisions apart from Scripture?
- 8) How can dreams (or spiritual experiences in general) become more about us than about God?
- 9) How can we trust God is still working even when we don't experience anything dramatic?
- 10) **Read Hebrews 1:1–2.** What does this text tell us about Jesus? How does focusing on Christ reshape the way we think about guidance, assurance, and hearing from God?
