Questions for Further Discussion: Read Genesis 44

1) The sermon describes an awakened conscience as painful but purposeful. Can you share a time when conviction or hardship helped redirect your life toward God?

- o Psalm 119:67
- o Hebrews 12:10-11
- o 2 Corinthians 7:9-10

2) The biblical idea of repentance was described as “going in a different direction.” How does that definition deepen or change your understanding of repentance?

- o Acts 3:19
- o Isaiah 55:7
- o Luke 15:17-20

3) Joseph’s brothers could have abandoned Benjamin just as they once abandoned Joseph, but instead they returned together to Egypt. What does this reveal about the transformation taking place in their hearts?

- o 1 John 3:16-18
- o Philippians 2:3-4

4) Judah went from selling Joseph into slavery to offering himself as a substitute for Benjamin. What stands out most to you about Judah's change?

5) Read Genesis 45:1-2. Why do you think Joseph was so overwhelmed emotionally when he saw his brothers' transformation?

6) The sermon emphasized that sanctification is not just gaining knowledge, but becoming more like Christ. What are some practical signs that a person is growing spiritually?

- o 2 Corinthians 3:18
- o Colossians 3:10
- o Galatians 5:22-23

7) Which of the three aspects of sanctification most encouraged or challenged you?

- o Positional sanctification (declared righteous)
- o Experiential sanctification (growing in holiness)
- o Final sanctification (future perfection in glory)

8) The sermon asked whether our appetites are changing spiritually. What are some things you once desired that now seem less attractive as you grow in Christ? What godly desires are becoming stronger?

- o Romans 12:1-2
- o Psalm 42:1-2
- o Galatians 5:16-17

9) Judah's willingness to become a substitute points ahead to Jesus Christ. How does Judah's story help you appreciate Christ's sacrifice more deeply?

- o Genesis 49:10
- o Mark 10:45
- o 2 Corinthians 5:21
- o Romans 5:8

10) The sermon ended with the question: "Is Christ changing you?" In what specific area of your life do you most want to see transformation right now?
