Black History Moment: -- We celebrate the life and legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The long battle to make Martin Luther King Jr. Day a federal Holiday, started in 1968, four days after Rev. King's assassination a bill was introduced by Congressman Conyers, an African American Democrat from Michigan. The bill failed but he kept reviving the bill, but it kept failing but he didn't give up. It was not until the 1980s that Congress acted on Conyers' bill. By this time, the congressman had enlisted the help of popular singer Stevie Wonder, who released the song "Happy Birthday" for King in 1981. Conyers also organized marches in support of the holiday in 1982 and 1983. Conyers finally succeeded when he reintroduced the bill in 1983. But even then, support was not unanimous. On Nov. 2, 1983, Pres. Reagan signed a bill making Martin Luther King Jr. Day a federal holiday effective Jan. 20, 1986. As a result, Americans commemorate Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday on the third Monday in January. It required a 15-year-long fight, but Conyers and his supporters successfully won King national recognition for his service to country and humanity. Happy Birthday to You!!

In Phila there are 320 Penna official blue and yellow historical markers. It was announced on Jan. 7<sup>th</sup> Hakim's Bookstore founded by author and scholar Dawud Hakim in 1959, in a few weeks will receive a marker. It is the

Bookstore founded by author and scholar Dawud Hakim in 1959, in a few weeks will receive a marker. It is the first and oldest Black-owned bookshop in Phila. He took the books he used to sell out of the trunk of his car and placed them on the shelves. This small storefront houses hundreds of works by African American authors. This West Phila. bookstore has been advocating the power of knowledge in the fight for racial justice for decades and now, they're making it into our state's history books. Congratulations to his daughter Yvonne Blake and family as they continue to carry on their father's legacy. Here are a few of the many African American establishments located in Phila. that have historical markers, African Zoar Methodist Episcopal Church - Founded here in 1794 by 15 men and three women from St. George's Church, led by Rev. Harry Hosier. Zoar was active in the Underground Railroad and moved to 12th and Melon Streets in 1883. It is United Methodism's oldest Black congregation. The marker is located at 401 Brown St., Christian Street YMCA, opened in 1914, this was the first Black YMCA to have its own building. A social center and meeting place for African American organizations, it provided recreational and educational opportunities for members of the Black community A.M.E. Book Concern, 631 Pine St., Here in 1836 a church related company began printing hymnals, religious materials, and works by Black authors of the period. In 1847 The Christian Recorder was published here. Bishop Benjamin Tucker Tanner was editor of the firm until 1884.

I can't forget the marker right outside on the corner the church, on School Lane, "Village of LaMott" originally called Camptown this village was laid out at the close of the Civil War on the site of former Camp William Penn. This camp was a training station for negro troops enlisted in the US Army from 1863 to 1865. They are historical markers all over these United States of America, you might be in the area of some or one of them maybe go check them out. Our History!!
