Human trafficking generates \$150 billion each year and enslaves an estimated 40 million people.*

Human Trafficking affects women, men, and children in every country of the world – people who are unable to walk away, under the threat of violence, forced to do things they don't want to do.

They may work in industries such as:



domestic labor



commercial sex



estaurants + hospitality



factories + manufacturir



construction + landscaping



agriculture forestry

What does human trafficking look like? Children selling fruit in India. Men forced to work in fields or on fishing boats in Thailand. Women coerced into selling their bodies in Amsterdam or Atlanta. Migrant workers harvesting tomatoes in Florida and California. It might even affect the person serving you at your favorite restaurant.

Human Trafficking is everywhere. It's in our closets, cupboards, and kitchens. It's in our neighborhoods and around the globe.

Our world is broken, but we are not powerless. There is a place for all of us in the movement to set captives free. What might your role be?





our ethos

We believe that human trafficking is a symptom of a deeper problem.

The real problem is that relationships, communities, and systems are broken. Human trafficking are products of poverty, racism, sexism and gender-based violence, abuse, civil war, addictions, and more.



We believe that in order to end human trafficking, we need to start by rebuilding community. Basing our action on the character of Jesus, we partner with God and others to serve with compassion at the margins and work to bring hope and healing to our broken neighborhoods.

This community-focused, Jesus-centered approach is about more than seeking justice for the oppressed. It's about pursuing shalom. It's about flourishing, forgiveness, abundance, peace, salvation, reconciliation, and grace.

This is not a faraway strategy—this is something we're all called and able to participate in.

In the 1860s "Free" Methodists worked to abolish slavery in the United States. In 2010 Rev. Kevin Austin became a USA missionary to the problem of human trafficking and the Set Free Movement started to form. In 2020 Set Free Movement Monterey Bay was established as was MyPlace in Jackson, Michigan

John Wesley called slavery "the sum of all evils".

At the 2007 Free Methodist General Conference the Free Methodist Church agreed to take up the cause against slavery in our modern context. In 2015 Eden's Glory, a restoration home for women rescued out of human trafficking became the first ministry spinoff.



Our teams engage in a deep, sustainable, long-term process starting with prayer and creating community where people organize around gifts. This approach (depicted at right) is incarnational and discipleship-driven, guided by the Holy Spirit.

Yvonne and Lillian, through their organization Thrive, are supporting and equipping young women in Kenya. In a context where violence against women is high, Thrive mentors young women to become role models and community advocates, seeking to address vulnerabilities to gender-based violence and human trafficking.

It is estimated that between 60-85% of "commercially sexually exploited children" within the US were at one time in the child welfare system.* Foster youth are incredibly vulnerable to human trafficking. Camille, our Leader in Seattle WA, is working to provide an avenue of hope for youth as they exit foster homes, providing necessary life skills training and first apartment essentials.
