Mary Anderson — Athlete, Veteran, Mentor, Community Builder

Meet Mary Anderson — a West Akron native whose lifelong commitment to fitness, service, and neighborhood youth shaped the West Akron 5K. Her race is more than a run: it's a community health initiative, a scholarship engine, and a multigenerational legacy.

Mary Anderson was raised in West Akron and matriculated through Akron Public Schools, graduating from Buchtel High School "1040" in 1994. She earned a BS in Physical Education from Walsh University and an MS in Education from the University of Akron. A collegiate athlete (basketball and track) on a partial scholarship, Mary joined the Army National Guard to assist with her education and went on to serve 20 years and 8 months. She's a fitness instructor (Operation Keep It Moving), a youth coach and mentor, and an active worship leader at United Baptist Church.



From Vision to Reality

At the age of 16, though in church most of her life, Mary's cousin Michelle Jones invited her to United Baptist Church, she's been a faithful member since. Mary discovered organized running while deployed in Afghanistan and kept running after she returned home. Seeing few Black people represented at local races and recognizing severe health disparities.

In 2013, she launched the West Akron 5K in partnership with United Baptist Church (UBC). With UBC as a proud sponsor, the event has grown into an accessible, community-driven initiative that promotes physical activity, offers health screenings, and raises vital funds for neighborhood schools.

Westside Connection

Mary's roots run deep in West Akron, where she grew up immersed in neighborhood sports, local schools, and a strong church community that shaped her character and purpose. Those early experiences instilled in her the values of discipline, mentorship, faith, and giving back—principles she continues to live out daily. Now serving as the Buchtel 6th Grade Girls Basketball coach, Mary pours into the next generation both on and off the court, using sports as a vehicle to teach confidence, teamwork, and resilience. Her presence extends beyond athletics into schools and church programs, where she remains hands-on, building meaningful relationships and creating opportunities for youth to thrive. Through her consistent service, Mary embodies what it means to invest in her community—turning her upbringing into a lifelong mission to uplift and empower others.

Impact and Investment

Since its founding, the West Akron 5K has generated and returned more than \$25,000 to the Buchtel cluster schools—supporting scholarships, athletic equipment, and community programs. Mary Anderson extends heartfelt thanks to the sponsors, volunteers, vendors, partners, and community members whose generosity and service have made the race’s impact possible.

What keeps her motivated

Mary is driven by the health and future of her community, the progress she sees in the youth she mentors, and the desire to close disparities in fitness and access to care. Mentoring young people, coaching middle-school girls, and helping community members as a fitness instructor with the Downtown Akron Partnership adopt healthier habits, keeps her focused. She’s motivated by faith, service, and the tangible impact of small actions multiplied across generations.

Future and Legacy of WA5K

Mary’s vision is to make the West Akron 5K the largest African American-centered race in the USA, and also to reduce local health disparities and expand investment in Buchtel-cluster schools through scholarships, equipment, and program funding. She aims to scale partnerships with health providers, increase participation and volunteerism, and inspire other neighborhood races to form.

TOWANDA MULLINS

Towanda Mullins has served United Baptist Church for nearly 30 years, a steady and respected leader whose commitment to faith and community yields tangible results. She advances advocacy, focused philanthropy, and practical education initiatives that strengthen families and expand opportunity. As chair of the Scholarship Committee, she directs fundraising, rigorous selection, and mentorship, and has developed youth programs housed at United such as Ready2Work, along with the Gus Johnson Tutoring Program creating dedicated learning spaces for youth. Her work also includes leading the Million Dollar Sojourner Truth Project, mobilizing resources and partnerships to create clear pathways to higher education, careers, and sustained civic engagement.

To date, the ministry has awarded over \$40,000 in scholarships to high school and college students. Beyond monetary support, scholars have received reference letters, mentorship, and access to expanded opportunities—including full-tuition, four-year scholarships. These outcomes are a testament to the vision, dedication, and leadership behind the ministry.

UBC SCHOLARS



Established in 2010 under Towanda Mullins' leadership, the United Baptist Church Scholarship Ministry was built on a foundation of faith, service, and opportunity.

Even prior to its formal establishment, the ministry had already been sowing seeds of support as early as 2005—providing graduating seniors with financial gifts, Bibles, recognition in graduation newsletters, and encouragement as they transitioned into their next chapter.

Grounded in the principle of New Mercies, the ministry recognizes that each scholar represents a renewed opportunity to invest in the future. Its mission extends beyond financial assistance to include mentorship, academic preparation, and holistic support. Early initiatives included ACT tutoring, ensuring students were academically equipped to access higher education and succeed once there.

Faith, Futures, and Funding

The Scholarship Ministry is supported by a committed team including James Anderson, Tracey Gordon, Duane Jordan, Towanda Mullins, Dee Dee Pitts, Tresha Orr-Primm, Georgia Richardson, and Tristan Reed. The partnership with University of Akron scholars has further strengthened programming and outreach, reflecting a collaborative spirit that continues to grow.



Through innovative and community-centered fundraising efforts—such as concerts, spoken word events, “Ministers Who Cook,” cook-offs, bake-offs, and movie and chili nights—the ministry has fostered both financial sustainability and strong community engagement. These efforts reflect a shared commitment to uplifting scholars through collective investment.

The youngest of three children born to Andre and Denaye Black, Sonni is currently a senior at Hoban High School. Intelligent, creative, and driven, she has always carried limitless potential and a heart set on higher education.

Like many students, Sonni explored a range of colleges—from Howard University to others—while facing a common question: how to fund her future. Grounded in faith, she remained active in the UBC youth department, consistently serving, volunteering, and pouring into her role as a loving aunt to her niece, Penny.

Her faith met opportunity through the mentorship and leadership of Towanda Mullins. 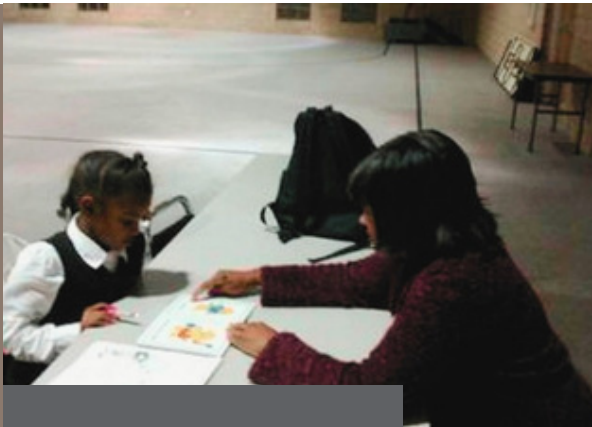

The United Baptist Church Scholarship and Ready to Work Program was established in 2008 under the leadership of Towanda Mullins, who envisioned a structured pathway to prepare youth for life beyond high school. With guidance and collaboration from Barry Jackson and Angela Smith, a comprehensive and impactful program was developed to equip teens with the tools necessary for workforce readiness, college preparation, and military pathways.

Fingerprints on the Future

The Ready to Work Team—Towanda Mullins, Tracey Gordon, Barry Jackson, John Robertson, Angela Smith, and Janine Bowens—provided impactful sessions for an average of 6–8 youth each meeting. The curriculum focused on life and career readiness, including public speaking, business etiquette, résumé writing, mock interviews, money management, online job searches, team building, respect for authority, and practical skills such as tying a tie.

Rooted in both personal experience and passion, Towanda Mullins believed that intentional, focused training over the course of eight weeks could significantly alter the trajectory of a young person's life. Her and her husband having raised their own son and supported many nephews who grew up in her home, she recognized the critical need for early exposure to discipline, structure, and future planning—particularly for young men.



FOCUSED ON THE FUTURE

She consistently reinforced the message: "You have two options post high school graduation / college or the military." All would attest who lived under her roof she was the disciplinarian like no other; Proverbs 22:15 "foolishness is bound up in the heart of a child, but the rod of correction will drive it far from him".

Her own journey reflected this philosophy. By pursuing both higher education and military service, she earned two degrees, purchased her first home at the age of 25 and another at 30, and graduated debt-free through the use of the GI Bill. These experiences shaped her commitment to ensuring that young people, especially those at-risk youth whose households may not have had conversations about the future, were equipped with knowledge, confidence, and direction.

The program's impact has been lasting, with many former participants now thriving in their mid-30s across diverse careers. Program leaders also supported scholars through recommendation letters, networking opportunities, and college readiness efforts, including assistance with full-tuition scholarships.

The Ready to Work Program operated successfully for many years until the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, which led to its transition to two virtual sessions before its official conclusion in 2022.

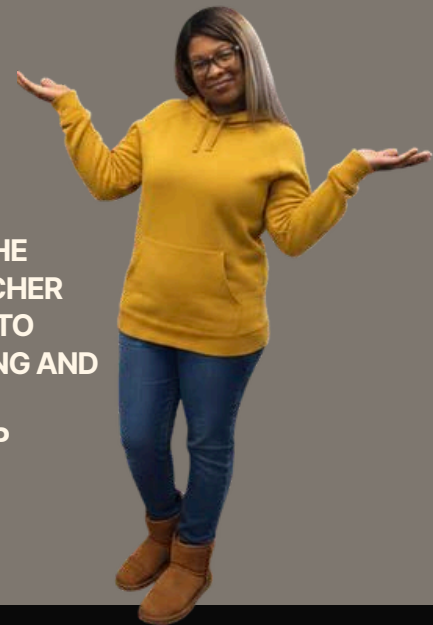

REV. RANSOM SPENCER TATUM

Rev. Ransom Spencer Tatum (1885–1935) was a seminal Akron religious leader who founded the United Baptist Church in 1926.

1935

Pastoral History

Born about 1885, Reverend Ransom Spencer Tatum was a foundational figure in Akron's religious and civic history, serving as a spiritual architect for two of the city's most prominent Black congregations. After arriving in Ohio from Macon, Alabama, he took the pulpit as pastor at St. Paul Baptist Church in 1922, where he famously oversaw the construction of the congregation's first permanent church building. His leadership reached its zenith in 1926 when he became the founding pastor of United Baptist Church. For nearly a decade, he shepherded United Baptist through the immense challenges of the Great Depression, establishing a legacy of resilience and faith that lasted until his death in December 1935. His "Homecoming" service was a major event in Akron, drawing together the city's ministerial alliances to honor a man who had literally and spiritually built the community's foundations.

At the heart of Reverend Tatum's life was his family, anchored by his wife, Sally (Sallie) Tatum, who remained a dedicated member of the Akron community long after his passing. Together, they raised a family on Raymond Street that reflected the aspirations of the Great Migration generation. Their son, James Ransom Tatum, carried forward his father's name and industrious spirit, while their daughters, Penola and Mary, grew up within the vibrant church culture their father helped create. The Tatum household was a hub of both faith and family, and the distinctive "Ransom Spencer" name became a multi-generational mantle in Akron.

The Reverend's life and ministry came to a sudden close when he passed away on December 23, 1935, at the age of 50 the same year he resigned from the United Baptist Church as pastor. His health had been in decline during his final months at United Baptist, leading to his resignation shortly before his death. His passing was a significant loss for the city, marked by a massive "Homecoming" service that drew together the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance and hundreds of mourners. He was laid to rest in Glendale Cemetery, leaving behind a spiritual house that continued to thrive under his successors, forever honoring the man who laid its first stones.

Pastor Tatum still has relatives in the Akron and Cleveland areas and is a relative-in-law of a current UBC member, Sister. Towanda Mullins.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT CONNIE MITCHELL



7 Decades of Dedication

As United Baptist Church celebrates its 100th anniversary, longtime member Connie Mitchell is reflecting on more than seven decades of faith, fellowship, and service within the church family. Born into a family rooted in faith and community, Mitchell is one of five children and the only daughter of J.K. Brinson Sr. and Eunice Brinson. She credits her parents—especially her mother’s unwavering commitment to church attendance and raising her children in the faith—as the foundation of her lifelong connection to United Baptist Church.

Mitchell’s spiritual journey began at just seven years old when she first attended UBC. She later joined officially and was baptized at the age of thirteen.

Over the years, Mitchell has faithfully served in numerous ministries, including the Usher Board, Trustee Board, Repast Committee, Senior Saints Committee, and as a member of the Junior Choir. She credits her mother’s commitment to church attendance and raising her children in faith as the foundation of her lifelong connection to UBC.

“I have been a member for above seventy-three years,” Mitchell shared. “The preaching, teaching, bonding of friendships, and the love that was felt and shared by each member has kept me rooted in UBC.”

Among her fondest memories are Sunday morning devotions, the Senior Choir marching down the center aisle singing old spirituals, annual revivals, and church fundraisers such as the St. Patrick Day Tea, Martin Luther King Jr. Tea, Rainbow Tea, and Mother Moore’s homemade ice cream after Sunday service.

Mitchell also remembers the impact of leaders who helped shape her faith. She spoke warmly of Ms. Turner, a former youth leader on Bellows Street, who ensured young people were grounded in God’s Word while also creating joyful activities for them to enjoy. Mitchell also expressed gratitude for the pastors of UBC whose preaching and teaching guided her through life’s challenges.





USHERING IN GOD'S PEOPLE

AN INTERVIEW WITH CONNIE MITCHELL



One ministry especially close to Mitchell's heart has been ushering. She attended the School of Ushering and later graduated as an instructor. Through that work, she met and served with ushers across Akron and throughout the United States.

Mitchell recalled a difficult season in her life when Pastor Pounds' sermons spoke directly to her heart, giving her courage to pray, trust God, and seek breakthrough.

Looking toward the future, Mitchell believes young people are essential to the continued growth of the church. "We need more young people today in the church because they are the future of our church," she said. "I would advise them to join a church, always pray, and trust God's direction for their life."

As UBC marks a century of ministry, Mitchell prays the church continues to support its leadership, grow stronger, and remain "a living testimony that goes beyond the walls of UBC."

"USHERING IS A MINISTRY TO SERVE OUR PASTOR AND TO SERVE ALL WHO ENTER THE DOORS OF OUR CHURCH WITH KINDNESS AND A SMILE," SHE SAID.

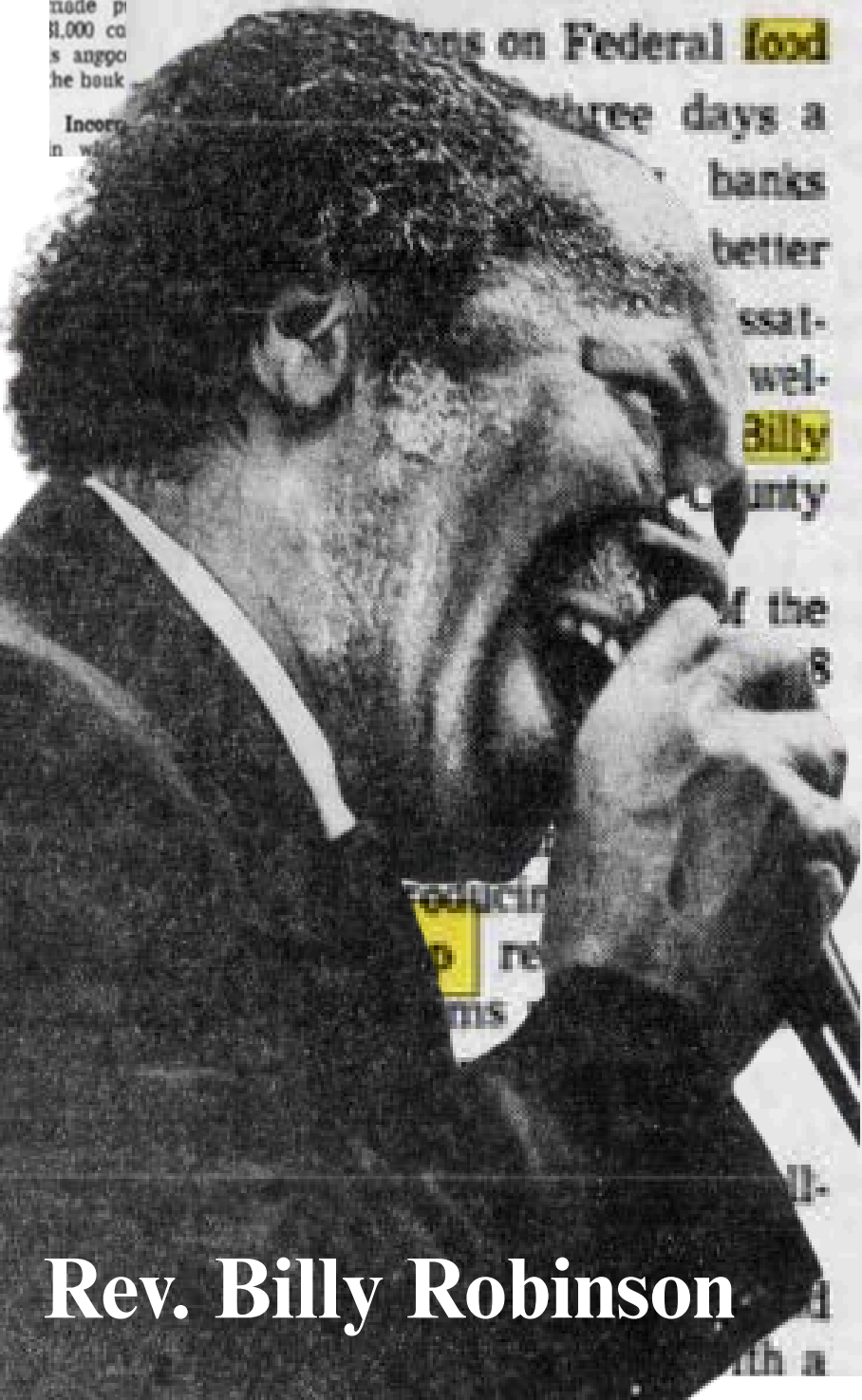
