Revelation 19:11 Then I saw heaven opened, and a white horse was standing there. Its rider was named Faithful and True, for he judges fairly and wages a righteous war. **12** His eyes were like flames of fire, and on his head were many crowns. A name was written on him that no one understood except himself. **13** He wore a robe dipped in blood, and his title was the Word of God. **14** The armies of heaven, dressed in the finest of pure white linen, followed him on white horses. **15** From his mouth came a sharp sword to strike down the nations. He will rule them with an iron rod. He will release the fierce wrath of God, the Almighty, like juice flowing from a winepress. **16** On his robe at his thigh [*Or On his robe and thigh.*] was written this title: King of all kings and Lord of all lords. (NLT)

Revelation 19:11 And I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse, and He who sat on it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and wages war. **12** His eyes are a flame of fire, and on His head are many crowns; and He has a name written on Him which no one knows except Himself. **13** He is clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God. **14** And the armies which are in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, were following Him on white horses. **15** From His mouth comes a sharp sword, so that with it He may strike

down the nations, and He will rule them with a rod of iron; and He treads the wine press of the fierce wrath of God, the Almighty. **16** And on His robe and on His thigh He has a name written: "KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS." (NASB)

Revelation 19:11 Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war. **12** His eyes were like a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except Himself. **13** He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God. **14** And the armies in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses. **15** Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. **16** And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS. (NKJV)

Revelation 19:16 On his robe at his thigh [Or On his robe and thigh.] was written this title: King of all kings and Lord of all lords. (NLT)

Revelation 19:16 And on His robe and on His thigh He has a name written: "KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS." (NASB)

Revelation 19:16 And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS. (NKJV)

What is the _____ of Revelation 19:16?

- And He has a name written...
 - John sees a specific, identifiable title given to Jesus. Throughout Scripture, God's self-chosen names unveil His character and authority.

Exodus 3:14 God replied to Moses, "I am who I am. Say this to the people of Israel: I am has sent me to you." (NLT)

Isaiah 9:6 For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (NLT)

- This "written" name is permanent, visible, and unchangeable, echoing God's declaration in Malachi 3:6, "For I the LORD do not change."

Malachi 3:6 "I am the Lord, and I do not change. That is why you descendants of Jacob are not already destroyed." (NLT)

- Revelation repeatedly highlights names that reveal destiny—overcomers receive a "new name," yet Christ's own name stands as the ultimate revelation of who He is.

Revelation 2:17 "Anyone with ears to hear must listen to the Spirit and understand what he is saying to the churches. To everyone who is victorious I will give some of the manna that has been hidden away in heaven. And I will give to each one a white stone, and on the stone will be engraved a new name that no one understands except the one who receives it." (NLT)

- ... on His robe...
 - The robe (outer garment) represents Christ's public, royal identity. Kings wore distinctive garments to display their rank.

1 Kings 22:30 The king of Israel said to Jehoshaphat, "As we go into battle, I will disguise myself so no one will recognize me, but you wear your royal robes." So the king of Israel disguised himself, and they went into battle. (NLT)

Esther 6:8 he should bring out one of the king's own royal robes, as well as a horse that the king himself has ridden—one with a royal emblem on its head. **9** Let the robes and the horse be handed over to one of the king's most noble officials. And let him see that the man whom the king wishes to honor is dressed in the king's robes and led through the city square on the king's horse. Have the official shout as they go, 'This is what the king does for someone he wishes to honor!'" (NLT)

- Earlier in the chapter, "He is dressed in a robe dipped in blood" (Revelation 19:13), recalling His sacrificial victory.
 - ▶ The title on that same robe declares that the One who shed His blood now rides to _____.

Isaiah 63:1 Who is this who comes from Edom, from the city of Bozrah, with his clothing stained red? Who is this in royal robes, marching in his great strength? "It is I, the Lord, announcing your salvation! It is I, the Lord, who has the power to save!" **2** Why are your clothes so red, as if you have been treading out grapes? **3** "I have been treading the winepress alone; no one was there to help me. In my anger I have trampled my enemies as if they were grapes. In my fury I have trampled my foes. Their blood has stained my clothes. (NLT)

- Clothing imagery underscores righteousness and triumph.

Isaiah 11:5 He will wear righteousness like a belt and truth like an undergarment. (NLT)

Psalm 93:1 The Lord is king! He is robed in majesty. Indeed, the Lord is robed in majesty and armed with strength. The world stands firm and cannot be shaken. (NLT)

- ... and on His thigh...
 - The thigh, close to the sword at His side (Revelation 19:15), signals power and readiness for battle.
 - ▶ Placing the name here associates His identity with _____ strength.

Psalm 45:3 Put on your sword, O mighty warrior! You are so glorious, so majestic! (NLT)

- In Genesis 24:2 and 47:29, oaths sworn “under the thigh” invoked solemn authority; likewise, Christ’s thigh bearing this title affirms the certainty of His rule.
 - ▶ In our society today, when you take an oath, you put your right hand over your heart or on a Bible.
 - ▶ According to Jewish tradition, allowing someone to sit on one’s hand was a sign of submission to authority. If this is the symbolism, then Joseph was showing his obedience to his father by placing his hand under Jacob’s thigh.
 - ▶ Our custom is to swear on a Bible; the Hebrew custom was to swear on circumcision, the mark of God’s covenant.

Genesis 17:10 This is the covenant that you and your descendants must keep: Each male among you must be circumcised. (NLT)

Genesis 24:2 One day Abraham said to his oldest servant, the man in charge of his household, “Take an oath by putting your hand under my thigh. (NLT)

Genesis 47:29 As the time of his death drew near, Jacob called for his son Joseph and said to him, “Please do me this favor. Put your hand under my thigh and swear that you will treat me with unfailing love by honoring this last request: Do not bury me in Egypt. (NLT)

- The dual placement—robe and thigh—makes the name unmistakable whether viewed from a distance (robe) or up close in combat (thigh).

- ... KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS...
 - The title declares _____ sovereignty. No earthly ruler or spiritual power rivals Him.

1 Timothy 6:15 For, At just the right time Christ will be revealed from heaven by the blessed and only almighty God, the King of all kings and Lord of all lords. (NLT)

Daniel 4:34 "After this time had passed, I, Nebuchadnezzar, looked up to heaven. My sanity returned, and I praised and worshiped the Most High and honored the one who lives forever. His rule is everlasting, and his kingdom is eternal. **35** All the people of the earth are nothing compared to him. He does as he pleases among the angels of heaven and among the people of the earth. No one can stop him or say to him, 'What do you mean by doing these things?' (NLT)

- "King of kings" assures persecuted believers that Caesar is not supreme; Jesus is.

Revelation 17:14 Together they will go to war against the Lamb, but the Lamb will defeat them because he is Lord of all lords and King of all kings. And his called and chosen and faithful ones will be with him." (NLT)

- "Lord of lords" echoes Deuteronomy 10:17, affirming Yahweh's unparalleled majesty now fully revealed in Christ.

Deuteronomy 10:17 "For the Lord your God is the God of gods and Lord of lords. He is the great God, the mighty and awesome God, who shows no partiality and cannot be bribed." (NLT)

- Together, the phrases fulfill Psalm 2:6-12, where the nations must submit to God's Anointed.
 - ▶ At His return, Jesus subdues all rebellion.

Psalm 2:6 For the Lord declares, "I have placed my chosen king on the throne in Jerusalem, on my holy mountain." **7** The king proclaims the Lord's decree: "The Lord said to me, 'You are my son. Today I have become your Father. **8** Only ask, and I will give you the nations as your inheritance, the whole earth as your possession. **9** You will break them with an iron rod and smash them like clay pots.'" **10** Now then, you kings, act wisely! Be warned, you rulers of the earth! **11** Serve the Lord with reverent fear, and rejoice with trembling. **12** Submit to God's royal son, or he will become angry, and you will be destroyed in the midst of all your activities—for his anger flares up in an instant. But what joy for all who take refuge in him! (NLT)

Revelation 11:15 Then the seventh angel blew his trumpet, and there were loud voices shouting in heaven: "The world has now become the Kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he will reign forever and ever." (NLT)

What does it say about Christ's _____?

- Authority Declared by His Name
 - The title is written, not spoken—His royal claim is permanent, public, and undeniable.

Revelation 19:1 text (NLT)

- "King of kings" means every _____ authority answers to Him (1 Timothy 6:15).

Deuteronomy 10:17 "For the Lord your God is the God of gods and Lord of lords. He is the great God, the mighty and awesome God, who shows no partiality and cannot be bribed." (NLT)

- "Lord of lords" elevates Him above every _____ power.

Colossians 2:15 In this way, he disarmed the spiritual rulers and authorities. He shamed them publicly by his victory over them on the cross. (NLT)

- The placement on His robe and thigh reflects the ancient location of royal seals, underscoring legitimacy and covenantal right (Psalm 2:6-8).
- Because Scripture is true and literal, this vision foreshadows His visible return to rule.

Acts 1:11 "Men of Galilee," they said, "why are you standing here staring into heaven? Jesus has been taken from you into heaven, but someday he will return from heaven in the same way you saw him go!" (NLT)

- Scripture Echoes of His Supreme Rule
 - Daniel 7:13-14: The Son of Man receives "dominion, glory, and a kingdom that will never pass away."

Daniel 7:13 As my vision continued that night, I saw someone like a son of man coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient One and was led into his presence. **14** He was given authority, honor, and sovereignty over all the nations of the world, so that people of every race and nation and language would obey him. His rule is eternal—it will never end. His kingdom will never be destroyed. (NLT)

- Matthew 28:18: _____ authority is granted to Jesus.

Matthew 28:18 Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth." (NLT)

- Philippians 2:9-11: _____ knee bows in recognition to Christ's authority.

Philippians 2:9 Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest honor and gave him the name above all other names, **10** that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, **11** and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (NLT)

- Colossians 1:16-18: All things were created through Him and for Him; He holds first place in everything.

Colossians 1:16 for through him God created everything in the heavenly realms and on earth. He made the things we can see and the things we can't see—such as thrones, kingdoms, rulers, and authorities in the unseen world. Everything was created through him and for him. **17** He existed before anything else, and he holds all creation together. **18** Christ is also the head of the church, which is his body. He is the beginning, supreme over all who rise from the dead. So he is first in everything. (NLT)

- Implications for My _____
 - Obedience: If He rules over kings, He certainly rules over my calendar, wallet, and words.
 - Confidence: No chaos can dethrone the One who wears the undisputed title.
 - Perspective: Political shifts are temporary; His reign is eternal.

Psalms 46:6 The nations are in chaos, and their kingdoms crumble! God's voice thunders, and the earth melts! **7** The Lord of Heaven's Armies is here among us; the God of Israel is our fortress. Interlude **8** Come, see the glorious works of the Lord: See how he brings destruction upon the world. **9** He causes wars to end throughout the earth. He breaks the bow and snaps the spear; he burns the shields with fire. **10** "Be still, and know that I am God! I will be honored by every nation. I will be honored throughout the world." (NLT)

- Worship: My praise joins heaven's chorus, acknowledging His unmatched supremacy.

Revelation 5:12 And they sang in a mighty chorus: "Worthy is the Lamb who was slaughtered—to receive power and riches and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and blessing." **13** And then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea. They sang: "Blessing and honor and glory and power belong to the one sitting on the throne and to the Lamb forever and ever." (NLT)

- _____ to the King Today
 - Submit daily plans to His will—He owns the schedule.
 - Measure decisions against His commands—He sets the standard.
 - Speak of Him with reverence—His name carries royal weight.
 - Stand firm in trials—loyal subjects trust their King's victory.

John 16:33 "I have told you all this so that you may have peace in me. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world." (NLT)

- Serve others selflessly—representing the kingdom's values.

Mark 10:45 "For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many." (NLT)
