Day 1: Everyone Has a Role

Scripture Reading: Exodus 17:8-10

Devotional:

The Israelites were attacked by the Amalekites, and Joshua would lead the army into battle, while Moses would stand on the hill with the staff of God. Aaron and Hur also went with Moses to help.

Everyone's responsibility was different. Joshua fought on the battlefield. Moses prayed and trusted God. Aaron and Hur stayed beside Moses. No one was doing the exact same job, but every job mattered. Not everyone sings on stage, teaches a class, or preaches a sermon. But every person has a role that helps God's team. Sometimes we think our job isn't important because it isn't seen by many people. But God sees every act of service. He cares about faithful hearts *more* than important titles. When we all do the part God has given us, we help God's team grow stronger!

Discussion:

1. What were the different roles that Moses, Joshua, Aaron, and Hur each had? How was each helpful?
2. What is one way you could be helpful at home, school, and church?

Prayer:

God, thank You for giving everyone a special role. Help me faithfully do the part You have given me. Amen!

Day 2: We Need One Another

Scripture Reading: Exodus 17:11-12

Devotional:

As long as Moses held up the staff of God, the Israelites were winning the battle. But after a while, Moses became tired. His arms grew heavy, and he couldn't keep holding them up by himself. That's when Aaron and Hur stepped in. They found a stone for Moses to sit on, and each one stood beside him and held up his arms until the battle was over. Aaron and Hur didn't complain or say, "That's Moses' job, not my job!" They saw someone who needed help, and they gladly stepped in. There are times when all of us need help. No one is strong enough to do everything alone. God created us to encourage one another, help one another, and work together. When we help others, we show God's love.

On God's team, we don't leave people to struggle alone but instead we lift one another up!

Discussion:

1. How did Aaron and Hur help Moses?
2. Who is someone in your life that you could encourage or help this week? How would you help them?

Prayer:

Jesus, help me be aware and notice when others need encouragement, help, or support. Show me how I can help and serve with a joyful heart. Amen!

Day 3: Working Together Brings Victory

Scripture Reading: Exodus 17:13

Devotional:

When the battle was over, Joshua and the Israelites won the victory. But it wasn't just because of one person. Joshua fought bravely. Moses prayed and trusted God. Aaron and Hur supported Moses when he grew tired. Everyone worked together, and *God gave the victory*. This teaches us an important lesson: God's team is strongest when everyone works together. God has given each of us different gifts and abilities. Some people are good at encouraging others. Some are great listeners. Some love to serve behind the scenes. Some enjoy leading. Every gift is important because every person is important. Instead of comparing ourselves to others, we should celebrate the different ways God uses each person. When everyone plays their part, God's work grows and His love shines brightly.

Discussion:

1. Why wasn't Joshua the only reason why Israel had won the battle?
2. Why is it important that everyone uses the gifts God has given them?

Prayer:

God, thank You for giving each person unique gifts. Help me celebrate others and gladly work together as part of Your team. Amen!

Day 4: Remember Who Gives Us the Victory

Scripture Reading: Exodus 17:14-16

Devotional:

After the battle, Moses built an altar and named it "The Lord is my Banner." A banner was a flag carried into battle that showed who the army belonged to. When we're on God's team, everyone has an important part to play, but all the glory belongs to God. Whether you're helping at church, serving your family, encouraging a friend, or sharing God's love, remember that you're serving on God's team. When everyone faithfully plays their part and gives God the credit, amazing things happen. God delights in using ordinary people who are willing to serve Him together.

Activity: "Teamwork Challenge"

As a family, choose one project that requires everyone to help. Maybe cleaning a room, baking cookies, washing the car, or putting together a puzzle. Before you begin, give each family member a different job.

After you're finished, talk about these questions together. Could one person have finished the project alone? How did everyone working together make the job easier? Finish by thanking God for giving each family member different gifts and praying that your family will continue to work together as part of God's team.

Prayer:

God, thank You for allowing me to be part of Your team. Help me faithfully do my part & encourage others and remember that You are the One who deserves all the glory. Amen!
