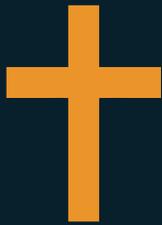
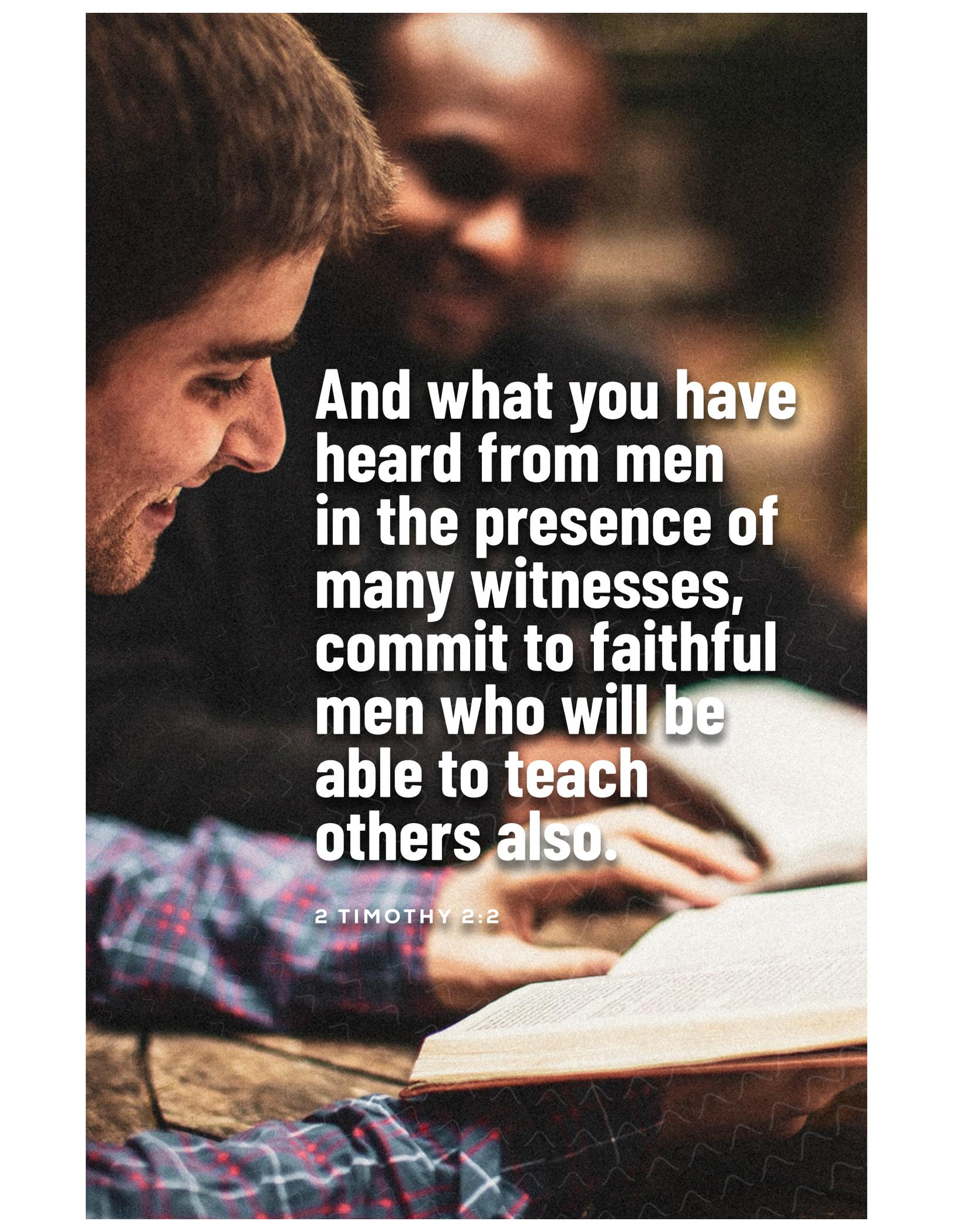

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How To Use This Guide

YOU ARE ABOUT TO ENTER AN EXCITING SEASON OF ACCELERATED SPIRITUAL TRANSFORMATION.

The F.A.I.T.H. Huddle environment encourages us to engage with God's Word and His people in a way that most of us never have before. As His Spirit works in our lives, it creates a passion to help others experience the same thing.

The F.A.I.T.H. Huddle Starter Guide is an interactive booklet that introduces each element of the group and helps your group start strong. We would encourage each member of the group to have a booklet and use it to guide you through the first few weeks of meetings.

This resource will help your group have four important conversations:

WEEK 1 - GOALS, EXPECTATIONS, ACCOUNTABILITY

The first meeting will discuss what a F.A.I.T.H. Huddle is and the expectations and aspects that make this time of discipleship unique.

WEEK 2 - SHARE YOUR STORY

Before you look forward, spend time getting to know the stories of those in your group. The trust and empathy you develop by hearing each other's stories will increase the impact this group will have on your life.

WEEK 3 - INTRODUCING H.E.A.R. JOURNALS, SCRIPTURE MEMORY, RHYTHM OF MEETING, AND PRAYER

In the third week, you will be discussing the H.E.A.R. Journal method, the importance of Scripture Memory, Prayer for one another, and establishing the Rhythm of your time together.

WEEK 4 - F.A.I.T.H HUDDLE TIMELINE

During the fourth week, you will continue the rhythm that you established in week 3. Implementing the weekly disciplines and methods to carry on for the continuation of your Huddle.

How To Form Your F.A.I.T.H. Huddle

ARE YOU READY TO START A F.A.I.T.H. HUDDLE, BUT AREN'T SURE WHERE TO START AND WHO TO INVITE?

If your F.A.I.T.H. Huddle isn't formed yet and you need help identifying and inviting people into your group, follow the steps below to form your F.A.I.T.H. Huddle.

STEP 1

Identify the 3-5 people you will invite into your F.A.I.T.H. Huddle.

STEP 2

Personally reach out to the people you have identified that you would like to be in your Huddle and invite them.

STEP 3

Set when your first meeting will be and when and where you will meet for the upcoming season.

Week 1

Goals, Expectations, & Accountability

WELCOME TO WEEK 1 OF OUR F.A.I.T.H. HUDDLE!

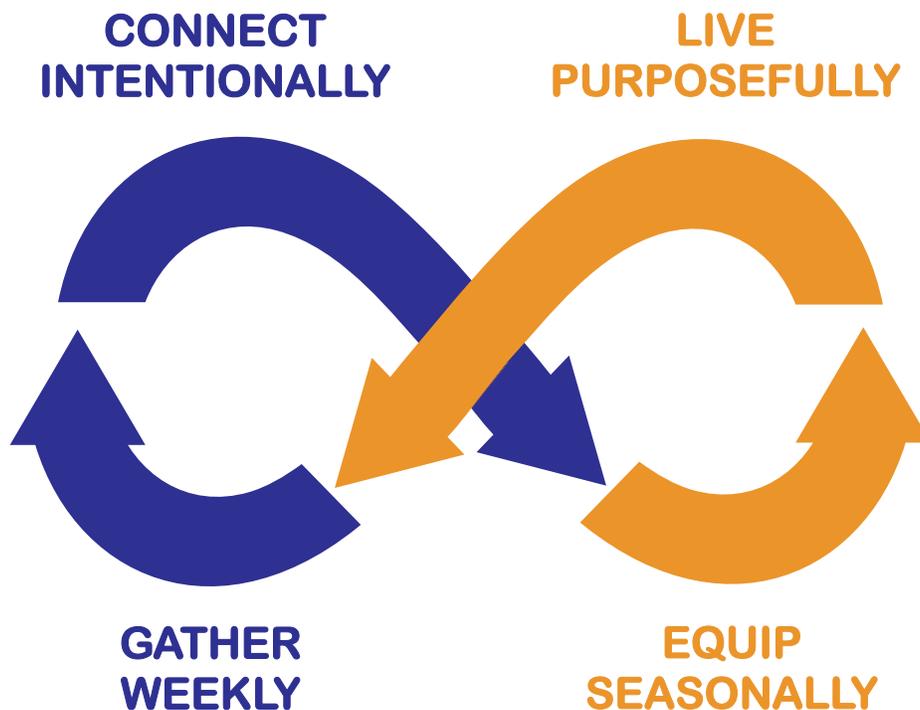
For today's meeting, we will discuss where we are going as a F.A.I.T.H. Huddle, how we will get there, what we will expect from each other, and what makes this method of Discipleship unique.

WHERE ARE WE GOING?

F.A.I.T.H. Huddles foster a season of accelerated spiritual transformation. It is a highly relational and committed group of believers that are calling each other to look more like Jesus. Over the next season, this group is committing to help each other look more like Jesus in five ways. We call it the F.A.I.T.H. characteristics of a disciple.

HOW WILL WE GET THERE?

Read 1 TIMOTHY 4:7-8

During the upcoming season, we will “train in godliness” by focusing on four weekly disciplines. When we meet as a group, our meeting time will work through each of these disciplines.

BELOW ARE THE FOUR WEEKLY DISCIPLINES:

1. Bible Engagement
2. Scripture Memory
3. Accountability
4. Prayer

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. Which of the four weekly disciplines are you currently doing best in?

2. Which do you need to grow the most in?

Below is a picture of how the F.A.I.T.H. of the Disciple & the four Weekly Disciplines work together. This picture shows where the group is going and how we will get there.



WHAT WILL HAPPEN?

As we allow the Word of God to work in our lives we will see its impact through five areas known as the F.A.I.T.H. of a Disciple.

I am studying God's Word and asking the Holy Spirit to reveal to me the things I don't understand and practice the things I do.

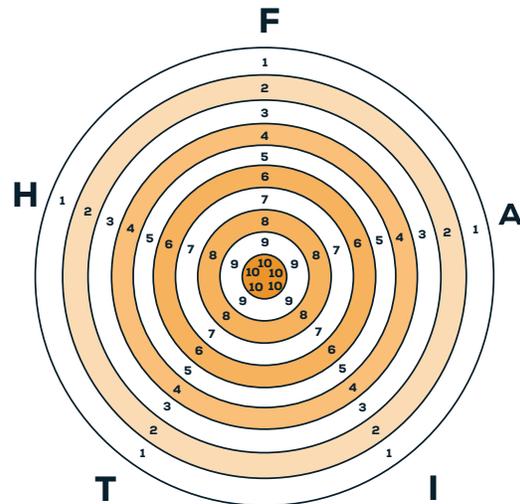
T TRUSTWORTHY FRIEND

Accountability Questions

CORE QUESTIONS

Each week, we ask these two questions:

1. Which of your H.E.A.R. Journals stood out the most to you this week and what are you doing about it?"
2. How have you been praying for and investing in your ONE this week?

ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS

With the additional time that you have in the group, ask your group specific questions that will allow them to share about additional parts of their life.

Faithful Follower:

1. What does being a doer of the Word look like in your daily life?
2. How are you daily seeking God's will?

EXPERT TIP

One suggestion is to ask each person to share with the group their answer to the following question:

"Which question grabs your attention the most and why?"

Available Servant:

1. How are you actively serving inside and outside of the church?
2. How are you creating margin in your life to better serve others?

Intentional Learner:

1. How do you spend your daily time with God?
2. What is the Holy Spirit revealing about the quality of your Christian life during your time of reading and studying the Scriptures?

Trustworthy Friend:

1. How are you creating an environment where friends can safely share their struggles?
2. How are you preparing yourself biblically to befriend others in their time of need?

Helpful Guide:

1. How are you guiding others to a faith-filled life in Christ?
2. How are you loving people where they are while maintaining biblical integrity?

Before Your Second Meeting

Hinge Moments

One of the most powerful things God gives each person is their story. Your story is unique to you, and when you leverage your story, it can be a tremendous blessing to you and those around you.

The problem is that though every person has a unique story, few have slowed down to see how God has been active in the high points and hard times. God has been writing a story in your life; the question is if you will connect your story to God's mission.

In order to do that, every believer must be able to articulate how God's story (the Gospel) has changed their story. Before your second F.A.I.T.H. Huddle meeting, take time to reflect on the questions below and complete the exercise on page 12.

In the first section, identify Hinge Moments in your life. A Hinge Moment is an experience or season of time that has changed the trajectory of your life. Write down 10 "High Points" (times of success or joy) that you can think of throughout your life. Then, write 10 "Hard Times" (times of failure or grief) that you can think of throughout your life.

HINGE MOMENT REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. What are my truly formative experiences in life—that is, what has made a lasting impact?
2. Is there any common thread to my experiences?
3. Why do I do what I do vocationally? Did one person or event significantly determine this?
4. Who are my most meaningful friends?
5. Who taught me how to live? How am I learning to live like Christ?
6. How has God's grace been revealed in my life?
7. How does my unique story bring God glory?
8. What would my life be like without God?
9. What may God be preparing me to do in my life?

Week 2

Share Your Story

WELCOME TO WEEK 2 OF OUR F.A.I.T.H. HUDDLE!

This week is all about getting to know one another's story. As each person shares, listen for how God has been at work in their story and what you are excited to learn from them in the season ahead.

SHARE YOUR HINGE MOMENTS

Once your group is settled in, transition to sharing your Hinge Moments. Before the group starts sharing, identify how much time each person has to share. You want to be sensitive both to the person that is sharing and that the entire group gets to share.

Have each member share their top six Hinge Moments of their life and explain why they chose those times. What impact did each of those moments have on their life? If there is still time to share, have each member share what they learned from the exercise.

Either at the end of each person's story or after everyone has shared, take time to pray over each F.A.I.T.H. Huddle member.

Week 3



H.E.A.R. Journals, Scripture Memory, Rhythm of Meeting, & Prayer

OVER THE NEXT TWO WEEKS, YOUR GROUP WILL INTRODUCE EACH ELEMENT OF A NORMAL FAITH HUDDLE MEETING.

Once all the elements are introduced, you will follow a simple rhythm through the four weekly disciplines. Below is an example of a normal F.A.I.T.H. Huddle rhythm.

The pace and content of the conversation is set by the discernment of the leader. The times will vary depending the amount and personalities of the people in the group.

EXAMPLE FAITH HUDDLE RHYTHM

FELLOWSHIP: ⌚ 10 MINUTES

Spend the first ten minutes catching up. If you want, you can be more structured in this time and have each person share his or her “high” and “low” of the week.

SCRIPTURE MEMORY: ⌚ 5-10 MINUTES

After everyone quotes the week’s memory verse, ask, “*As you meditated on this verse, what stood out to you?*” We want to store God’s Word in our heart, not just be able to recite it.

BIBLE READING AND H.E.A.R. JOURNALS: ⌚ 25-35 MINUTES

As you share H.E.A.R. Journals, a great question to ask is, “*Which of your H.E.A.R. Journals stood out the most to you this week and what are you doing about it?*”

ACCOUNTABILITY: ⌚ 10-25 MINUTES

In addition to our H.E.A.R. Journal question, we always ask: “*How have you prayed for and invested in your ONE this week?*” Additionally, we will discuss a question from the Accountability Questions on page 9.

PRAYER: ⌚ 10 MINUTES

Finish the time by having each person share something specific and personal that the group can pray for.

What is a H.E.A.R. Journal?

A H.E.A.R. JOURNAL IS A SIMPLE WAY TO HELP YOU READ THE BIBLE WITH THE INTENTION OF APPLYING IT.

By asking four simple questions, you can understand and apply any passage. In addition, journaling is a great discipline because it helps you retain three times more of what you read.

Every week, each of us will share a H.E.A.R. Journal and discuss what we have heard from God's Word. There is not a set amount of H.E.A.R. Journals that you must do each week, but the goal with this discipline, as with all of the others, is to improve as time goes on. Consider how often you currently journal and do "+1" of that. So, if you have never journaled, just try to do a couple a week. If you journal occasionally, try to do three times a week. The hope is that as you get more comfortable with this discipline and experience its benefit, you will want to increase this number throughout the year.

Take a look at the H.E.A.R. Journal example on the next page. As you read through your reading plan this week, create a H.E.A.R. Journal by using these four questions.

H (HIGHLIGHT)

What is a verse(s) that stood out to you in your reading?

E (EXPLAIN)

What is the author's intended meaning in the context of the passage?

A (APPLY)

What is the principle to live by today?

R (RESPOND)

How will I respond to the application in my relationships and/or situations this week?

When the group gets together next week, you will share your H.E.A.R. Journal, and as a group discuss how to best use this method.

Sample H.E.A.R. Journal

Daily Reading: PHILIPPIANS 4

Date: JANUARY 10

H (HIGHLIGHT)

"I AM ABLE TO DO ALL THINGS THROUGH HIM WHO STRENGTHENS ME." PHILIPPIANS 4:13

E (EXPLAIN)

PAUL WAS TELLING THE CHURCH AT PHILIPPI THAT HE HAS DISCOVERED THE SECRET OF CONTENTMENT. NO MATTER THE SITUATION IN PAUL'S LIFE, HE REALIZED THAT CHRIST WAS ALL HE NEEDED, AND CHRIST WAS THE ONE WHO STRENGTHENED HIM TO PERSEVERE THROUGH DIFFICULT TIMES.

A (APPLY)

IN MY LIFE, I WILL EXPERIENCE MANY UPS AND DOWNS. MY CONTENTMENT IS NOT FOUND IN CIRCUMSTANCES. RATHER, IT IS BASED ON MY RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS CHRIST. ONLY JESUS GIVES ME THE STRENGTH I NEED TO BE CONTENT IN EVERY CIRCUMSTANCE OF LIFE.

R (RESPOND)

LORD JESUS, PLEASE HELP ME AS I STRIVE TO BE CONTENT IN YOU. THROUGH YOUR STRENGTH, I CAN MAKE IT THROUGH ANY SITUATION I FACE.

How Will We Do Scripture Memory?

"I know of no other single practice in the Christian life more rewarding, practically speaking, than memorizing Scripture... No other single exercise pays greater spiritual dividends! Your prayer life will be strengthened. Your witnessing will be sharper and much more effective. Your attitudes and outlook will begin to change. Your mind will become alert and observant. Your confidence and assurance will be enhanced. Your faith will be solidified."

EVERY WEEK, WE WILL HAVE A VERSE THAT WE WILL MEMORIZE.

This is a largely neglected discipline that has amazing benefit for the believer. The discipline's purpose is to store God's Word in our heart (Psalm 119:11). For this reason, we do not want to only memorize verses, but to meditate on them as we do it. Once everyone recites the verse, the group will discuss what stood out to them as they meditated on it.

THE MORE ALIGNED OUR GROUP IS IN THIS DISCIPLINE, THE MORE BENEFICIAL IT WILL BE.

It will be helpful for everyone to memorize the same passages. Though it is not required to use the same translation, it benefits everyone when we are able to work as a team to say the same verse in the same translation.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. What experience do you have with Scripture Memory?
2. How could you see Scripture Memory being beneficial in your life?

THIS WEEK

After choosing the memorization plan you will use, begin with the first verse this week. Additionally, keep working through your reading plan and completing a H.E.A.R. Journal.

Who's Your One?

We want every believer to identify ONE person in their life who is far from God and intentionally pursue that person with the hope of the gospel by praying, investing, and inviting.

As a F.A.I.T.H. Huddle, we continually encourage and hold each other accountable to be intentional with this relationship. Once you identify who this person is, we want to commit to doing three things:

PRAY

We will pray daily for these names. We will ask God to make them aware of Christ's love and their need for Him (2 Cor. 4:4; Matt.13:15) and to give them the faith to repent and believe (Acts 20:21; Romans 10:9-10).

INVEST

We will create ways to invest weekly in these people's lives. Our hope is to build a relationship where we can share Christ's love with them (1 Cor. 9:19-23). As we invest in someone's life, we build trust, which creates more opportunities to share the Gospel.

INVITE

As we pray and invest, we invite them to the next right thing. The ideal would be to share your faith and invite them to enter into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. When people aren't there yet, we can invite them to belong in our community before they believe. We do this by inviting them to events like our Small Group, a church outreach event, or a Sunday morning service. During the accountability time of our F.A.I.T.H. Huddle each week, we will ask *"How have you been praying and investing in your ONE this week?"*

How exciting would it be if they come to know Jesus and then joined your next F.A.I.T.H. Huddle!

Take a moment and identify one person in your life who either doesn't have a relationship with Jesus or is disengaged with the local church. This person should be someone you see on a regular basis. Consider your family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, classmates, etc. Once you identify this person, write their name down and share a little about this person with the group.

Week 4

F.A.I.T.H. Huddle Rhythm



TODAY WE WILL BE PUTTING INTO ACTION ALL OF THE SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES THAT WE HAVE DISCUSSED OVER THE PAST THREE WEEKS.

Below is the example F.A.I.T.H. Huddle meeting flow. This is a helpful reminder of how what you learn today will be implemented in the future weeks.

EXAMPLE FAITH HUDDLE RHYTHM

FELLOWSHIP: ⌚ 10 MINUTES

Spend the first ten minutes catching up. If you want, you can be more structured in this time and have each person share his or her “high” and “low” of the week.

SCRIPTURE MEMORY: ⌚ 5-10 MINUTES

After everyone quotes the week’s memory verse, ask, “*As you meditated on this verse, what stood out to you?*” We want to store God’s Word in our heart, not just be able to recite it.

BIBLE READING AND H.E.A.R. JOURNALS: ⌚ 25-35 MINUTES

As you share H.E.A.R. Journals, a great question to ask is, “*Which of your H.E.A.R. Journals stood out the most to you this week and what are you doing about it?*”

ACCOUNTABILITY: ⌚ 10-25 MINUTES

In addition to our H.E.A.R. Journal question, we always ask: “*How have you prayed for and invested in your ONE this week?*” Additionally, we will discuss a question from the Accountability Questions on page 9.

PRAYER: ⌚ 10 MINUTES

Finish the time by having each person share something specific and personal that the group can pray for.

Week 1 Leader Preparation

TIMELINE FOR WEEK 1

Topic: Goals, Expectations, and Accountability

Upon arrival:

- Explain what a F.A.I.T.H. Huddle is and also what the F.A.I.T.H. Disciple is.
 - °Utilize the “Target Illustration” on page 8 in the starter guide booklet.
 - Talk through how we all want to be the bullseye.

Discuss that this whole process is designed for a reason.

- We must BEGIN with the END.
 - °The reason behind this is so that the process is able to be multiplied throughout the body here at TVCC. REPLICATE and then REPEAT.

Questions to members:

- Why did you join this Huddle?
- What is one thing you hope to get from this time?

Emphasize the accountability aspect of F.A.I.T.H. Huddles.

- This is what makes Huddles different than things in the past

Leader: Discuss accountability questions on page 9

- This is a KEY part of the equation to create an environment where Growth can take place. **DO NOT** Skip this part as you move forward in your groups.
- Refer to the “Target” illustration for a refresher on this.
 - °The goal is for all involved to become more and more like Christ. As he held his Disciples accountable, we must as well.

TIMELINE FOR WEEK 1 (continued)

Discuss the actual process of the Huddle:

- Weekly Disciplines. **(ALL OF THESE ARE NON-NEGOTIABLE)**
 - Bible Engagement
 - Scripture Memory
 - Accountability
 - Prayer

Present the Covenant

- For each of you to sign.
- Establish the time and day each week that works for the members. This will not be an easy task, but this is where the sacrifice and accountability aspect of these Huddles comes in.
 - Each person must be willing to sacrifice 1-1.5 hr of their week to each other.
 - Do your best to make it the exact same time and place each week. This will allow for less confusion during the time of the huddles going forward.

Discussion of the Next Meeting:

- SHARING YOUR STORY: Hinge Moments
 - Have the members go through the next two pages before the next meeting.
 - Discuss the importance of getting to know one another.
 - Confidentiality and security within the Huddle.
 - Leader share your story at the end of the meeting. This will allow members to feel comfortable at the next meeting to share their story.

Closing Prayer:

For the future of this upcoming season of Spiritual Growth for each member that has signed the Covenant.

Week 2 Leader Preparation

TIMELINE FOR WEEK 2

Topic: Hinge Moments Discussion

- Leaders will explain this to members and will share their stories at the beginning of the meeting. This will help new members become comfortable with sharing.
- Spend the entire meeting allowing everyone to share their story and getting to know one another.

Upon arrival:

- Set the expectations for each member at a 30,000 ft view.
- Speak to the Vision of the F.A.I.T.H. Disciple and the impact that it can have going forward.
- Emphasize the importance of confidentiality within the Huddle.

Sharing Your Story:

- Set a time limit for each member verbally upfront. This will allow for each person to have equal time and opportunity to share.
- While each member is sharing, reiterate the importance of staying quiet and allowing the person to share without interruption. The floor is for the one sharing.
 - Leader: Ask the members the importance of their 6 most influential "Hinge Moments." So that they are able to see where God was and is moving through their story.

Closing Prayer: Each member, if comfortable, prays for another member of the group.

Week 3 Leader Preparation

TIMELINE FOR WEEK 3

Topic: H.E.A.R. Journals, Scripture Memory, Rhythm of Meeting, and Prayer

Before arrival: Hand out HEAR Journals

Upon arrival:

- Leader- use this meeting to begin the Rhythm of a Huddle.
- Brief fellowship together discussing highs and lows from the previous week.
- Ask the question: **“Where have you shared the Gospel this past week?”**
 - °With a follow-up question: **“Did they receive Christ?”**
 - This is not to make anyone feel guilty about not but to encourage and open the eyes of everyone to see where there was an opportunity to present the Gospel.

Explain the importance of the HEAR Journal:

- Go into the H.E.A.R. method of journaling.
 - °H-Highlight, E-Explain, A-Apply, R-Respond
- Understand that this is not the only way but an effective tool for those who have never journaled or that have issues journaling.
 - °Reemphasize that not every time you sit down to read and journal to try and “FILL” up the pages. The goal is for the Holy Spirit to speak to you and let Him dictate what and how much you write.
- Show the examples of the HEAR Method in your provided journals.

TIMELINE FOR WEEK 3 (continued)

Explain the Scripture Memory process:

- Make sure to not make this out to be an unattainable task each week. This is something that is a necessary aspect of this process.

-MEMORY MUST NOT BE NEGLECTED

- This is a major accountability aspect of these Huddles.
- Ask who all is or has done this in the past.
 - “What was the result?”
- Emphasize not to just memorize for the day like a test, but to apply the verse in our lives. We put to memory things that impact our daily lives, and Scripture Memorization ought to be at the forefront of this.
 - Essentially there is no grade given for memory verses. The Holy Spirit will use it when needed, but we first must store it in our hearts before He can ever use it.

Explain the Timeline of the Huddle:

- Emphasize the importance of being good stewards of everyone's time.
- That keeping in a rhythm is vital to the longevity and success of the Huddle.

Assign Reading Plan:

- The entire group must be on the same plan.
- Discuss that the next meeting will start the reading plan.
 - So the members are to read and prepare to share the following week.

Explain the “Who’s Your One?”

- Walk the group through this and explain the importance of sharing the Gospel. (page 18)

Closing Prayer: Guidance and Spiritual Growth for the Huddle.

Week 4 Leader Preparation

TIMELINE FOR WEEK 4

Topic: F.A.I.T.H. Huddle Timeline

Time: 10 minutes

1. Fellowship

- a. time and discussing the Highs and Lows of the previous week.

2. Ask the question:

- a. "Where and Who did you share the Gospel with this past week?"
- b. "Did they accept Christ as Lord?"

Time: 5-10 minutes

3. Scripture Memory:

- a. Each person quotes their memory verse. After each has quoted as the questions:
 - i. "Why did they choose that verse?"
 - ii. "How can they apply that verse in their lives, today?"

Time: 30-45 minutes

4. HEAR Journal sharing

- a. Begin with someone reading parts of the Scripture from the previous week.
 - i. This will help those who are not confident in reading aloud. Make sure to assist when needed to read.
 - ii. Try for each person to read the scripture aloud that spoke to them in their journal entry.
- b. Allow each member to share from their HEAR Journal.
 - i. Do not let just one or two people "control" the conversation.
 - ii. Always be sure to ask open-ended questions to help spur conversation and allow for others to speak.
- c. This should not be a time of "How much I know about Scripture." This time must be a comfortable and inviting environment to allow growth amongst all the different levels of members.
- d. As believers, though, we must help another brother or sister to know the truth of what they are reading. We are to correct someone if they are misinterpreting a text. We must do it in a constructive way to help them grow not fall away.
 - i. This is the impact of being a HUMBLE GUIDE.
