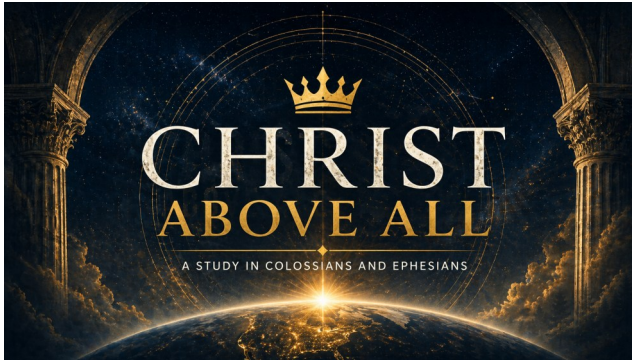

Tears of Finding Grace

“She stood at Jesus’ feet, crying. Then she began to wash His feet with her tears. She dried His feet with her hair. She kissed His feet many times and rubbed them with the perfume.” Luke 7:38 ERV

Simon the Pharisee. An unnamed woman “who had lived a sinful life.” He is looked up to. She is looked down on. He is a church leader. She is a streetwalker. He makes a living promoting standards. She’s made a living breaking them. He’s hosting the party. She’s crashing it. Whom did Jesus choose to honor that day?

Her reputation did not keep her from coming to Jesus that day. Those pious “followers” of His didn’t keep her from falling at His feet as her heart was broken and her eyes were raining tears on His feet. She did not come for them. She came for her Savior. You would have thought that it would have been Simon—he was a scholar who knew the words of Scripture. However, he was harsh and arrogant. But he was missing one thing—he did not comprehend the love of God. She did.

She came thirsty. Thirsty from guilt. Thirsty from regret. Thirsty from countless nights of being afraid of dying and waking up in hell. I knew a woman like that as well. That night in 1998 when she realized what her Savior’s Love and Grace meant to her. She had been thirsty for forgiveness for 28 years—yet could not forgive herself. So that night her heart heard Him speak to her heart, saying, “Child. I love you. You have been forgiven. Accept my Grace. Forgive yourself.

She didn’t just sip from that cup. She turned it up and gulped the contents to quench the thirst for her dry, parched soul. She fell at the feet of her Savior and covered those nail-scarred feet with an overwhelming flood of thankful tears. She forgave herself and boldly lived the rest of her life for Him. Her life was never the same. She lived the rest of her life loving others deeply. You see- we can't give what we've never received.
