





## RICK & BETTY ASCHMANN

*Ecuador  
Mission to the World*

Rick and Betty serve in Ecuador among the Quichua Indians. Rick's ministry focuses on leadership training, literature production, Bible translation, and church planting in the Quichua Indian language. Rick and his family served for many years in a cooperative agreement between Mission to the World (MTW) and Wycliffe Bible Translators, working in Colombia from 1981 to 1994. His first wife, Heidi

Marie, died in 1997 after a long battle with cancer. In 1998 Rick was reassigned to Ecuador to work in the Quichua Indian language.

Rick and Betty met in Ecuador in 1999 and married in 2000. Betty served with HCJB Global (Ecuador radio station) from 1992 until she married Rick. She worked in an international television production studio, producing Christian programs in Spanish for Latin America. She continues to produce videos on an occasional basis. After a two-year church-planting internship in Bogotá, Colombia, Rick was ordained as a pastor. In 2015 the Aschmanns returned to Ecuador to begin a new church-planting work among the Quichua Indians. Rick has also been involved in Bible translation projects in two of the Quichua languages of Ecuador to provide God's Word in the heart language of the Quichua people.

### Ministry:

Rick and Betty Aschmann serve in Ecuador among the Quichua Indians. Their son, Nathan and daughter, Anne, are both attending college in Nebraska. Rick's ministry focuses on leadership training, literature production, Bible translation, and church planting in the Quichua Indian language.

### Prayer:

Pray that God will guide us as we continually search for any and every way possible to reach the Quichua-speaking people for Christ. And praise God that through the health crisis, many of the Quichuas in our church plant have grown closer to the Lord and are learning to depend more on Him.

Praise God that the Old Testament translation for the Central Highland Quichua language is well underway and the Lord has provided funds for the next year of translation. Please pray that the translation will continue going strong and that God will provide various native Quichua speakers to do a final check.

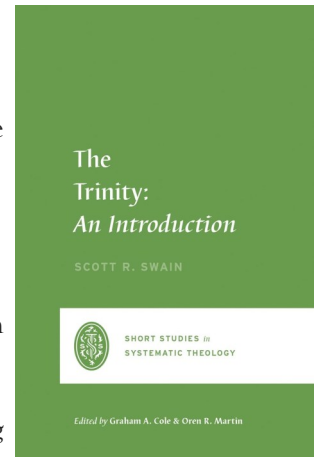
Pray that God will continue to keep us safe and healthy, despite the rampant crime and health issues in Ecuador and around the world.

to Christ Church on July 28.

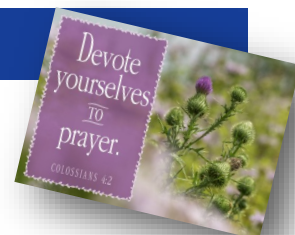

## Trail Life Trek



The theme for May was service. The troop was involved in three different service projects

- Trailmen completed a supply food drive for Lakemont Presbyterian's food pantry collecting over 150 lbs. of food, many hygiene and toiletries products that are hard to get from Golden Harvest, and \$115 in donations to help with the regular food and supply purchase.
- Trailmen provided support for a 10K race handing out water to runners.
- Trailmen helped to clean and set up the Wilson Family Y outdoor pool for summer activities and conducted our annual swimming test.

Many Trail Life awards include service components, and these projects fulfilled requirements for Woodlands Trailmen to earn their Worthy Life award and the Timberline Award which is the capstone award for Woodlands Trailmen. Navigator and Adventurer Trailmen are required to perform 15 and 20 service hours annually, respectively, in order to earn their ranking awards.

On May 11, the troop conducted our Spring Court of Honor when the year's achievements were celebrated and Mountain Lion trailmen advanced to Navigators to begin a whole new time of adventure and character development.

Although things slow down a little bit during the summer months, there are still Trail Life activities going on. In June, the troop will have a climbing day at Active Climbing in Grovetown. From June 14-20, the troop will be attending the Southeast Summer Adventure at Whitewater Express in Copperhill, TN with over 450 trailmen expected to attend. It will be a week of instruction as well as high adventure such as high ropes, rock wall, tomahawk throwing, mountain bikes, rifle, archery, zip line and whitewater rafting. Each day will begin with a morning devotion in camp.

In July, we will have our annual Water Fun Day with a giant slip and slide, water bottle rockets and a giant water gun fight.
