### THIS WEEK'S LESSON: YOUR KINGDOM COME



#### IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

In the last hours before His death, we see Jesus' sadness as He prays in the garden. Despite His own desires, Jesus ultimately prays for the Father's will to be done. In our own prayers, we should seek to know and follow God's way with our life. Matthew 6:10 & Matthew 26:36-46, In the Garden of Gethsemane



#### HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

How many appointments, practices, and meetings do you have to do this week that you'd rather not do? Tell your kids why you plan to do these things instead of skipping them. What would be the consequences for a missed appointment, a skipped sports practice, or a missed meeting?



#### AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why did Jesus pray for God's will to be done?
- How did Jesus pray for God's will to be done in the Garden of Gethsemane?
- Why is it important to seek God's will and not our own?



#### AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

*"This is how you should pray. Our Father in heaven, may your name be honored. May your kingdom come. May what you want to happen be done on earth as it is done in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, just as we also have forgiven those who sin against us. Keep us from sinning when we are tempted. Save us from the evil one." Matthew 6:9-13 (NirV)*



#### PARENT TIME: What you need to know:

Just as a parent knows what's best for a child, God knows what's best for all of us. This week, pray with your kids to have willing hearts to listen to and obey God. Ask God that His will might be done in your family, as it is in Heaven.
