## The Lord's Prayer Lesson 4

### THIS WEEK'S LESSON: OUR DAILY BREAD



#### IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Sometimes our situations seem hopeless – like in the story of Elijah and the widow – but God can work miracles to supply our needs. We should pray about our daily needs - food, clothes, health, etc. - to remind ourselves that all of these blessings come from God. Matthew 6:11 & 1 Kings 17:7-16, Elijah and the Widow



#### HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Talk with your kids about your monthly expenses - how much you pay for utilities, rent or mortgage, food, etc. How do you plan to pay for these expenses every month? How does God provide for these needs and others?



#### AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What did Elijah ask the woman to do?
- How did God provide daily bread for the woman and her son?
- Do you trust that God will meet your needs as well?



#### AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

*"This is how you should pray. Our Father in heaven, may your name be honored. May your kingdom come. May what you want to happen be done on earth as it is done in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, just as we also have forgiven those who sin against us. Keep us from sinning when we are tempted. Save us from the evil one." Matthew 6:9-13 (NIV)*



**PARENT TIME:** What you need to know: Sometimes things seem impossible or hopeless, but if we trust God, He will make a way. He will provide when we need it most and give us our daily bread. If you are struggling with worry about the future, ask God to give you daily bread and build your faith that He will provide.
