THIS WEEK'S LESSON: TEMPTATION



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

The Israelites give us an example of people who were tempted to sin against God and gave into that temptation. Jesus' prayer closes with the reminder that we have hope in the fact that God always provides a way out of temptation, ultimately by giving eternal life to those who put their faith in Him. Matthew 6:13 & 1 Corinthians 10:1-13, Warnings from Israel's History



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids if they say prayers more now than they did at the start of this series. Offer to help them create a quiet place where they can get away and pray in their rooms if they desire. Encourage them to pray daily, and practice the habit yourself.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why do you think the Israelites gave in to temptation so often?
- What did Jesus do to save us from our sins?
- Can you recite the Lord's Prayer, right now?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"This, then, is how you should pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." Matthew 6:9-13 (NIV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

Prayer can be our lifeline when we are tempted. It can show us the way out. Encourage your kids to pray when they feel tempted, and if they haven't made a decision to accept Jesus already, talk to them about what it means to give your heart to Jesus.
