5 Simple Ways to Make This Week's Lesson Stick



IN THE CAR:

Ask your kid, "What have you learned about God's ways not being like our ways all of the time?" Say, "We don't always understand His ways, but only He knows the future!"



HANGING OUT:

Come up with a schedule for the day and share the "game plan" with your child. Encourage them to obey your instructions so that everyone has a nice time. For instance, a day of cleaning the house, assign different chores to each person in the house and talk about the reward of pizza and a movie when the chores are finished. Another example could be a day trip you will take and the plans of what you will and will not be doing. Say, "When we obey God's instructions, we are blessed. God also commands us to honor our mother and father and obey their instructions."



AT DINNER:

Is it difficult to be obedient?

Why do you think God gives us instructions?

What wisdom does God and oftentimes parents have that gives them the authority to give instructions? (Hint: Only God knows the future and oftentimes parents can see what is coming because they have already learned from past mistakes and can share that wisdom with their kids.)



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Be humble in front of the Lord. And he will lift you up." James 4:10 (NIRV)



PARENT TIME:

This week was all about God's SVPs knowing that God's ways are not always like their ways. From Noah's ark to Gideon's army, people didn't often understand where God's instructions were taking them, but when they trusted and obeyed God, He blessed them. If your child is having a hard time obeying, it can have to do with a lack of trust, a lack of humility, or a lack of realizing that only God knows the future. We can let go of control and follow Him because He is omniscient! Encourage your child to trust and obey God because He knows what is best, even when we don't yet understand it.
