FAITH FAMILY “BUSINESS” MEETING RULES OF ORDER

I. REMINDERS

- We are called to love one another according to Matthew 22:37-39.
- ³⁷And He said to him, “‘YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.’ ³⁸This is the great and foremost commandment. ³⁹The second is like it, ‘YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.’ ⁴⁰On these two commandments depend on the whole Law and the Prophets.”
- We must therefore treat each other with respect.
- Please refrain from ill talk or hateful behavior.
- Every member has a right to their opinion, but we must respect opposing opinions.

II. MOTIONS

1. Any motion coming from a committee does not require a second.
2. Motions made by committees will be open to discussion.
3. If a motion is made by an individual, it will require a second before discussion on the motion may proceed.
4. If a motion made by an individual does not receive a second, the motion will not be taken to a vote or discussion.
5. A motion will be carried by majority vote.
6. *Members of First Baptist Church Richmond can only make motions.*

III. DISCUSSION OF MOTION

1. Discussion on motions must first receive a second before proceeding. The only exception is when a committee makes the motion(s).
2. Members must obtain the floor and be recognized by the presiding officer before beginning to speak. You must approach the microphone and state your name.
3. All speakers must be courteous and never attack other members or question the motives of the members.
4. A member can speak twice to the motion, but he or she can only take a second turn after everyone who wishes to speak the first time has spoken.
5. When speaking to a motion, it is important for the member to first let the assembly know which side of the issue he or she is on. Discussion will follow the rule of:
 - a. 3 minutes **FOR** the motion
 - b. 3 minutes **AGAINST** the motion
6. Discussion will end in one of the following ways.
 - a. There is no other discussion **FOR** or **AGAINST** the motion.
 - b. The Moderator calls for a vote.
 - c. Any member during discussion can “Call the question.”
 - i. A second will is required.
 - ii. If a second is received, the motion will be immediately called to vote without further discussion.

MINUTES OF THE CHURCH BUSINESS MEETING

February 25, 2026

Opening Business

Gary Curry asked Mike Reed to open the meeting with prayer at 6:06. Mr. Curry noted documents available at the back of the church, with digital copies available by tapping the sticker on the back of the pew. There were 91 people in attendance.

Mr. Curry reviewed the agenda for the meeting and asked if there was any new business to be added. Brenda Blankenship made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, with Ron Hunt seconding the motion, which passed unanimously.

Review of Minutes

Next, the regularly scheduled business meeting minutes from November 19, 2025, were reviewed. Bill Old noted the "s" at the end of his name should be deleted. Jessica Bevins made a motion to approve with Paul Beck seconding the motion. During discussion, a Bill Old questioned the word "restarted" under the Lead Pastor's Update. (*"They are interested in restarting and are looking for a new pastor."*) Dr. Farris noted a better word would be "replanting." The motion to accept the minutes with correction to the spelling of Mr. Old's last name passed unanimously.

Finance Report

Matthew Wade, finance committee chair, provided a report for the year-to-date general fund through December 2025. Total cash receipts \$2,195,624.01; total expenditures of \$2,260,021.52; ending cash balance of \$824,752.76. Charts included in the meeting packet detailed monthly receipts (budget vs. actual) and showed an increase in giving in November and December 2025. He provided detailed charts of expenses, with 52% of expenses going to personnel; 15% to missions; 10% to education and discipleship; 1% media ministries; 22% in operating expenses.

Lynn Collins made a motion to accept the report with Trish Isaacs seconding the motion. There was no discussion; the motion passed unanimously.

Lead Pastor Report

Dr. Farris provided a lead pastor report, celebrating the work God has been doing at First Baptist Church Richmond. Dr. Farris also promoted upcoming Encore service on Sunday at 6 p.m. He also mentioned he is planning to take his sabbatical in July and early August.

Celebrations:

- We have been pastor and people for 5 years and 4 months.
- Know Grow Show Go Report for Jan. 1, 2025-Dec. 31, 2025: Average Sunday morning attendance: 840 (**Know**); 699 unique persons attending a discipleship group at FBC (83%) (**Grow**); 561 unique persons actively serving on a team at FBC (67%) (**Show**); 465 persons serving on a mission (55%) (**Go**).
- 105 baptisms in 2025
- 21 days of prayer attendance: **2023**: 57 maximum attendance; **2024**: 117 maximum attendance; **2025**: 177 maximum attendance; **2026**: 222 maximum attendance. Attendance has surpassed goals every year.

Clarity:

- FBC Richmond is growing. Dr. Farris presented a slide on average attendance, showing increases each year since COVID. FBC is showing the highest average attendance in a decade, topping over 800 in 2025.
- Areas of crossroads of growth: Space for ministry and discipleship is lacking. In fact, enrollment is so high in the Learning Center that it is expanding into additional classrooms, but future growth is limited by space. Dr. Farris also noted the church is using creative ways to provide discipleship due to lack of space: off campus discipleship; multiple services, etc.
- Finishing partnership with River Church in Loveland, Colorado. Two additional mission trips are planned this year.
- FBC is financially behind because of weather.
- FBC is nearly fully staffed; the search is underway for the senior adult position.

Casting a vision

- We are already planning mission trips for 2027. FBC Richmond is planning a vision tour with NAMB to decide where we might plant next.
- We are in discussion with KBC to help us take the next step in preparing to build, with hopes of launching the capital campaign this fall.
- We have not arrived. We still have areas of ministry we desire to see flourish in the future. We had hoped to plant Foothills in Berea and then plans changed to

replant a church. In the meantime, William Dooley has taken a pastor position at Fairview Baptist Church. FBC is open to the Lord's leading related to a future plant.

Commit to pray

- Wisdom for steps forward on the building expansion.
- Favor to reach people for Jesus in Richmond.
- Where we should plant with NAMB next.
- Pray for how you can take your next step in Know, Grow, Show, Go.

Bill Old made a motion to accept Dr. Farris' report. Brenda Blankenship seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Written Reports

Mr. Curry mentioned that written January reports are not available due to weather interruptions.

Unfinished Business

Heather Combs, chair of nominating committee, and Margaret Hurt presented amendments to the Committee Organizational Manual. Amendments included the following, with additions noted in **green** and removals noted in **red**:

Amendment #1 "All committee **members**, council members, and team **coordinators members** will be members of First Baptist Church Richmond." (Page 5 of COM-Term & Service Structure)

Amendment #2 "Program Councils will utilize various term and service structures. Members of the council are filled by staff, chairpersons of committees, directors of program organizations, and/or at large members. The staff positions, chairpersons, and director positions will change as the staff, chairpersons, and directors' change. The at large positions will be based on a one (1) year term with the option of repeating the following year. **If a member has served three (3) consecutive years, that member will not be eligible to participate on that same council until a lapse of one (1) year.** For specific Membership Composition of a council see that specific council's description herein." (Page 5 of COM-Term & Service Structure)

Amendment #3 Service Teams will be based on an at large volunteer basis. **Each team member will be asked to serve one (1) year term with the option of repeating the following year.** For specific volunteer list **Membership Composition** of a team see that specific team's description herein." (Page 5 of COM-Term & Service Structure)

Amendment #4 "Each Administrative Committee and Program Council is to meet as often as necessary to fulfil its responsibilities. ~~It is advised that~~ The Administrative Committees are advised to meet on a monthly basis, but shall meet no less than four times per calendar year to ensure efficient operation of church business. The Program Councils must meet no less than four times per calendar year to ensure efficient operation of church ministries. Any special meetings shall be called as the need for such meetings arises. Committee and council meetings will be posted in the Sunday Worship Guide." (Page 6 of COM-Term & Service Structure)

Matt Morrison suggested to alter Amendment #3 to read as follows:

Amendment #3 Service Teams will be based on an at large volunteer basis. ~~Each team member will be asked to serve one (1) year term with the option of repeating the following year.~~ For specific ~~volunteer list~~ Membership Composition of a team see that specific team's description herein." (Page 5 of COM-Term & Service Structure)

Shawn Christian made a motion to accept the alternation above by Matt Morrison, with Bill Old seconding the motion that had no further discussion. The motion passed unanimously.

Furthermore, Mike Parke made a motion to accept the remainder of the amendments, with Brenda Blankenship seconding the motion. There were no questions or discussion related to the remaining amendments, and the motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Terry Barrett presented a proposal related to window replacement. Some windows show signs of rotting. Mr. Barret presented four bids to replace 53 three of the church's 57 windows. The Property Committee made a recommendation to replace the existing windows with aluminum windows using the contractor submitting the \$85,935.72 bid.

Mike Phelps made a motion to accept this recommendation, with Mike Parke seconding the motion. Brenda Blankenship asked which windows will be replaced. Mr. Barrett said 53 of 57 windows will be replaced throughout the church. The motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment

Matt Morrison closed the meeting in prayer. London Roberts made a motion to adjourn with Brenda Blankenship seconding the motion, which passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 6:43 p.m.

1. Missions Committee

Local Missions

- Clarkston, Georgia - Our college ministry partnered with NAMB to serve in Clarkston, Georgia over their spring break. They served in various areas including refugee ministry and community outreach. We have a group of 15 go on the trip, including Pastor Zac and Gabby Z, who led the trip.
- Upcoming Trips: June 13-18 and July 18-24 Loveland, CO Trip (15 people each trip)

International Missions

- June 16-23 Dominican Republic Trip (16 people going)

Missions Committee has been working on procedures to help guide the committee in establishing mission opportunities for the church.

2. Personnel Committee

This year we have had a few new hires...

1. Sara Fugate was hired in late Feb. as the Youth & College Ministry Assistant. We are excited for her to serve as she grew up at FBC through the ministries of Rachel, Steve & Zac.
2. Andrew Frazier began this semester as the Discipleship Intern; he is working with both Jonah and Rebekah in evaluating our Growth Track and will help in Men's Ministry after the summer.
3. Jassmyn Conner started this semester as the Social Media Intern, you have to thank her for all the fun and creative videos on Facebook, Instagram and TikTok.

We have also been working tirelessly to find our new Senior Adult Pastor; this has been a hard season for the committee as they are seeking the Lord's will and have been completing interviews with several great candidates. Please continue to pray for this committee as they seek out this new pastor.

3. Property Committee

At the last business meeting exterior windows were approved to replace the commercial windows that are beginning to rot. This project will begin at the end of June. In May the curbs in front of the office entrance were replaced from black-top curbs which were deteriorating to concreted curbs. This not only provided a sound structure but also good "curb-appeal".

A wall was removed in room 309-311 to accommodate larger groups for both Sunday, Wednesday and weekday purposes. This was completed via the facility team.

Parking Lot Handicap and Guest Signage were replaced as the original poles were rusting. The guest parking was moved to one side in front of the steeple entrance changing the amount from 16 to 12 spots. An additional 8 handicap spots were added in front of the office entrance.

Three trees were removed and the stumps grinded down at the Magnolia House as they had died. Choir room was repainted, and a TV was mounted. Two additional choir monitors were added to the sanctuary on the balcony wall.

MINISTRY REPORTS

4. Youth Ministry

Over the past semester, our student ministry focused heavily on helping students grow in boldness in sharing their faith. We concluded the semester with series called *Shine*, where students were challenged to live as lights for Christ in their schools, homes, and communities. Throughout the series, we emphasized practical gospel conversations, personal evangelism, and God's heart for the lost.

One of the highlights from the series has been the introduction of our "Gospel Wall," where students are tracking people they are praying for, sharing the gospel with, and individuals who have made decisions to follow Christ. It has been encouraging to see students take ownership of their faith and become more intentional about reaching others.

As we move into the summer months, we are looking forward to several opportunities for discipleship, outreach, and fellowship through camps, summer small groups, and special events. Our prayer is that this summer will continue to deepen students' faith while also creating opportunities to connect with new students and families in our community.

5. College & Young Adults

The spring semester has been a blessing for college ministry. God has been faithful to continue to do what only he can do in save students as we saw multiple salvations and baptisms. We have also had multiple students join in membership. We saw over 40 students on average attend each Monday night for Revive. This semester at Revive we took a deep dive into Colossians 3 and learned what it looks like to pursue holiness. Grow group we spent the semester studying a series called "battle of the mind" where we looked at the bible and anxiety, depression, lies we commonly believe, perfectionism, and more. It was incredibly fruitful for our students.

We also took our first spring break mission trip with a team of college students to Clarkston, Georgia to serve with the North American Mission Board.

Clarkston contains the most diverse square mile in America where over 50 different countries are represented. We got to work in local apartment complexes sharing the good news of the gospel while tutoring kids, helping a local international church that would have around 200 internationals there each week, and help serve the NAMB itself while growing closer together in community. We have also just welcomed our new college team. We have invited 12 students to participate in it. To grow closer to

Christ, grow in their own leadership ability, and help take ownership over the ministry.

Please pray for our students this summer. Around 15-20 of them will be going across Kentucky, USA, the Dominican Republic, and across the world. Young adult ministry has been a blessing as we have gotten to see new people get involved, multiple young adult age small groups thrive, and looking to continue to expand the ministry. So thankful to serve a church that loves investing in the younger generation.

We are continuing to offer an opportunity for men to meet for breakfast at Cracker Barrel once a month for fellowship and get to know new people.

Our next big event is an in-house breakfast on June 13th where our men's council will prepare and serve our men as we hear from NAMB missionary to ECU BCM; Mathew Dodge. We continue to try to enlist more men and glorify God as we draw together encouraging one another.

7. Children's Ministry

The first quarter of the year has been busy for our kids! On Sunday mornings we have been studying Moses. Wednesday evenings have been full of Bible skills, Scripture memorization, friendly competitions of Bible trivia, and tons of fun with friends! Our preteens, 4-7 graders, have had a couple of outings and we will continue meet with this group for community building and discipleship. Kids Ministry is now gearing up for summer. VBS is first up and we are expecting over 600 this year! There is still time to sign up to help. We need 225 leaders to make VBS happen, keep kids safe and secure and ensure the Gospel can be shared effectively!

We will have a full summer schedule for preschoolers and kids after VBS and will close out the summer with camp for about 65!

8. Women's Ministry

Our women's ministry has gotten off to an amazing start in 2026! The name we chose is Dwell Women's Ministry exists to equip women with biblical truth, encourage women in biblical community, and empower women to impact their homes, church and the world for Christ.

2. Emergency Expenditure

On March 23rd the Fire Panel located in the main office ceased to function, hindering the system from working properly. This kept the system from using the alarms, call feature to 911 and the fire pull boxes. We were immediately put on fire-watch by the fire marshal and would complete fire watch" every hour while the building was occupied. To remain in code, we had to replace this system. The Finance Chair and Lead pastor were made aware and approved this emergency expenditure. The total cost of this emergency expenditure was \$19,310.00. No vote is required but an update on this expense.

3. Bulk Purchase of LED Lights

The Property committee met on May 6th and decided to purchase a bulk order of LED 2x4 Panel Lights to replace 455 non-LED fixtures. After approving this request property then sent this to finance committee. Finance Committee met on May 12th and reviewed the proposal and voted to approve this request with the following understanding.

- 455 - 2x4 LED Panel Lights at a cost of \$39.75 per light.
- Total cost of \$18,086.25 will be taken from Property Reserve.
- After Purchase we will receive a \$4,550.00 rebate through KU and the rebate will be placed back into Property Reserve.
- These lights will be stored in the garage as the facility team begins to replace the fixtures.
- Estimated 6 months – 9 months to complete.
- Typical 2x4 fluorescent troffer light can utilize up to 160 watts per fixture. If we examine the same fixture utilizing LED technology instead, we see that the same fixture utilizes between 30 and 50 watts per fixture. This results in a 50% to 80% reduction in cost savings just by making the switch to LED.
